

### **DAVID GUSTAFSSON**

If you've ever wondered why our local framing business changed its name five years ago, then please keep reading. The current owner, David Gustafsson, gives the answer. He explains to editor Jaap Vogel how a business like his can be successful in a relatively small rural town like the Mountain.

"When my then-boss, Rod Schulte, decided to retire from his business, *Fine Art* and *Framing*, I was due to lose my job. Instead of that, I took over the business and continued my work as owner of *Viking Framer*. I chose that name because of my Swedish heritage."

"It was a steep learning curve. I'm a picture framer by trade and have become a very experienced professional (nearly 30 years' experience). That's the interesting and joyful part of the work, and something I really enjoy. The hardest part is the bureaucracy I now have to deal with as a business owner, like accounting and tax. The back end is the hardest part of business: you never realise how difficult and important it is"

"Over the past five years I've included more services in the business. We invested in quality printers and scanners to reproduce art works at a high standard; we work with artists to create their exhibitions in galleries. We also recently started holding exhibitions here in our own gallery. Almost all the exhibited work is made by local artists. I love our arts community, especially because the Mountain is very blessed, having many diverse artists as residents, even though I have to admit that I am at times puzzled by the 'politics' in the field.

"My work comes from the surrounding area: the Gold Coast and Brisbane. It's pretty easy to serve those markets from Tamborine Mountain. I cannot even think about moving the business to the Coast. The Mountain is a great place for a business like mine. Its community and feel suits bespoke cottage industries like mine."



### HAVE YOU EVER, EVER FELT LIKE THIS?

Hello everyone and wow, what a busy time it has been! School Holidays, Easter has come and gone, Rock'n the Rainforest echoed across the Mountain, and Mother's Day is just around the corner, how to keep up?

We have had a lot to do recently, with many and various requests from the community on a range of issues. I know how frustrating it can be when trying to deal with some of these matters because the responsible entity fails to take responsibility! (Trust me I get that same feeling; you know the one u) I will try to cover what I can in this short passage and implore you to take the time to read it:

Parking issues: Police can enforce Transport Legislation for a parking offence should an actual offence be committed. However, it is the responsibility of the Local Council and/or Qld Transport and Main Roads (depending on the road) when it comes to approving and placing of signage or implementing local by-laws to address same. I implore you to lobby them to have matters rectified should you feel aggrieved by a parking issue which I cannot solve. Some of these matters have genuine credit and I have supported the community in the past so please liaise with the proper authority.

**Neighbour Disputes** (think fences and trees): Please read the *Neighbourhood Disputes (Dividing Fences and Trees) Act 2011.* If you have an issue involving trees and fences with a neighbour, you have the option for it to be dealt with through QCAT; this is not a Police matter.

**Disputes between Parties**: Police DO NOT "take out an AVO" on someone because you don't like them or have some sort of dispute going on with them. We deal with domestic settings – but if your dispute is with someone else, then have a look at the *Peace and Good Behaviour Act 1982*. You can apply to the Magistrates Court (not the Police) for protection. If in doubt,

I am happy to answer that question.

#### **Crime and Traffic**

Don't say I didn't warn you because I did... We have been very proactive in recent weeks around both Crime and Traffic. It seems some people are robbing some village of an idiot, or they don't heed the advice. I'll let you be the judge.

- A 33-year-old male was charged with multiple counts of supplying a dangerous drug, possession of a dangerous drug and associated matters following a protracted investigation.
- A 23-year-old male was charged with Deprivation of Liberty, Threatening violence and drug offences following an incident over the Easter weekend.
- A total of five drink drivers will appear in Court, including a 40-year-old female who will appear in Court charged with a reading of 0.240%. YES – that's nearly five times the legal limit.
- A further six persons will be appearing in Court having been charged with Drug Driving offences.

It's not rocket science here — but to be clear again — we will be out in force, we will have Police from other areas of the State here, and we will be targeting those who think it is a joke or otherwise to put others' lives at risk, be it in the community or on the roads.

As always, report matters that might seem suspicious; your information is just a phone call away and may help save someone's life or protect their property, you never know.

# MAY IS SMALL BUSINESS MONTH

In May each year we celebrate our small businesses as we support them through small business month. The contributions made by small businesses help grow the foundations of thriving Queensland towns and communities. In the Scenic Rim we have many small businesses run by passionate - and very hard-working - individuals and families. Although it is important to buy local all year round (and I encourage you to do this where possible), this month is a time for us to celebrate and support the local economy and business owners. When you shop locally, your money stays local, with one dollar spent at a local business returning up to five times that amount through employee wages, rates and the purchase of materials and supplies. Representing over 90% of the economy in our region, they also employ many people locally, from school students starting their first job, to those working part-time into retirement.

Local businesses need our support, not only for the jobs they provide but for the contribution that so many give back to our community through sponsorships and support for great causes. Times have been tough over the past years, so let's support those that support us.

#### **GOAT TRACK UPDATE**

A few weeks back, Main Roads provided an update on Goat Track repair works which I shared on social media. One thing it did not mention was a new expected time for completion and re-opening. I followed up on this when I met with the Main Roads District Director (South Coast Region) in late April, and was told they expect completion in the "third quarter" of 2022. Obviously, this provides a wide timeframe, and as is normal with these types of works, it depends on the rain staying away most of the time and there being no other mishaps. I will inform the community if I become aware of any change here.

#### **FIRE SAFETY THIS WINTER**

Did you know that winter is the peak season for housefires? We're not quite in the winter season yet, but it is starting to cool down. Most fires are caused by everyday items such as cooking equipment, faulty or poorly maintained appliances, and flammable materials placed too close to heat sources. When heat and toxic smoke start to fill your home, your best chance of survival will be working, interconnected, photoelectric smoke alarms and a well-practised fire escape plan. Take five minutes now to get out alive. Young children and the elderly are the most at risk, so it's especially important to consider how they will escape safely. Make it a priority this winter to draw up an escape plan with multiple exits based on the location of the fire and practice it regularly with your family.

As your State representative I am always urging the National Parks Department to do more when it comes to hazard reduction burns in order to ensure that State land does not cause unnecessary danger to residents. Controlled burns around mid-year, with the aim of reducing fuel loads before the hotter, drier conditions return towards spring, are sensible, practical ways to reduce bushfire risk. I encourage residents to have a talk to the local Rural Fire Brigade if you have any questions or concerns about bushfire risks or prevention measures.

# COST OF LIVING HELP FOR OLDER AUSTRALIANS

A further 50,000 older Australians will have access to more affordable health care and medications to help ease cost of living pressures under changes to the Commonwealth Seniors Health Card.

A re-elected Morrison Government will increase the singles income test threshold from \$57,761 to around \$90,000 from July 1 this year, to give more Senior Australians access to the concession card. The couple's threshold will also increase from \$92,416 to \$144,000.

At the Commonwealth level, all card holders are eligible for cheaper medications and health care, and they may also be eligible for state, territory and local government savings such as discounted rates, electricity and gas bills, ambulance, dental, eye care, recreation and public transport.

The Coalition will invest more than \$70 million over four years to expand eligibility, helping an extra 50,000 senior Australians this year.

This means more Senior Australians could save hundreds of dollars, including up to \$428 a year for access to a monthly script for vital medicines and a refund for medical costs if they reach the Medicare Safety Net.

Currently, more than 436,000 Australians aged over 67 years who are not already receiving a pension or benefit have a Seniors Health Card. The income threshold change will mean more than 486,000 would be eligible, an 11 per cent increase.

#### PBS MEDICINES PRICES TO BE SLASHED

Millions of Australians taking common medications for blood pressure, high cholesterol, pain relief, depression, diabetes and more will save \$10 on scripts with a reduction in the price of Government-subsidised medications.

A re-elected Morrison Government will cut the price of medications listed on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) from January 1 next year.

The \$10 cut per script means the maximum price Australians will pay for PBS medicines drops from \$42.50 down to \$32.50, a 24 per cent saving.

Since 2013, the Coalition Government has approved more than 2900 new or amended listings on the PBS at an overall investment of \$16.5 billion.

All scripts currently counting towards a patient's safety net will continue to do so.

## **EVERY RIGHT TO BE WORRIED...**

The attractiveness of the town of Tamborine Mountain is ultimately dependent on its semi-rural ambience. This is achieved despite it being a surprisingly dense urban development. It accommodates 20% of the Scenic Rim's residents within 0.3% of the Shire's area. Quite a trick, particularly since we can't expand beyond the escarpments! How does it do it? Very simply, the town is turned inside out, compared to the norm.

For visitors, the ambience of a small-ish town is normally established as they drive through the adjacent semi-rural areas, then through the residential parts and ending up in the town centre. Most residents don't see much of the semi-rural.

On Tamborine Mountain, the housing development is predominantly on the edges, and we have retained a semi-rural core. What really makes it work is that our main traffic ways generally avoid going through the major residential areas. We take it for granted, but a visitor doesn't necessarily see many houses. Gallery Walk has its own priorities but, on the other hand, Main Street is on a side road. Complementing this is housing subdivision which gives plenty of room for trees and gardens, with locals taking full advantage. Planning Schemes over the decades with plenty of bottom-up involvement have achieved this happy result.

Now, our 'island in the sky' is threatened with change. The State Government has required local governments to develop strategies to accommodate a population growth of 11% over the next few years. To make matters worse, there is also a shift to top-down planning schemes, with local

experience and knowledge given little weight.

Unfortunately, our present Mayor seems blind to the special values and limitations of Tamborine Mountain. He outspokenly supports a one-size-fits-all approach. This includes Tamborine Mountain having to accommodate the same 11% increase in population as do the other parts of the Shire. The result would be damaging crowding of our 0.3% of the Shire. In the remaining, much less densely populated 99.7%, an 11% increase would actually be welcome. The Mayor's approach entirely overlooks some inconvenient facts:

- We are surrounded by escarpments and cannot expand
- We have recently had a period of major population growth
- We have limited semi-rural space and depend on our green core for ambience.
- Who would drive up a Mountain to reach just another urban subdivision?

Ominously, the Mayor has already foreshadowed more smaller block subdivision and multiple residences per block. He also foresees consequent revision of the Planning Scheme. With such revision tending to ignore local input, the outlook is not good. Our population growth must be thoughtfully managed and not in response to a simple quota.

Remember what happened to the goose that laid the golden eggs...

# Councillor's Comment

**DEREK SWANBOROUGH**DIVISION 1



### **GROWTH MANAGEMENT STRATEGY CONSULTATION**

The results are in, and Council will soon be publishing them. The Mountain has answered the call and responded in a show of force. I want to thank everyone who lodged a submission. The sheer relative weight of responses to the consultation simply says how much we care for, and value our Mountain.

I can't share the detailed results yet, but my observation is that the common messages to Council are unequivocal. It will be a test now to see what comes out of the process, and what weight the Mountain's views are given. From my perspective, having lived here for 36 years, and been at the centre of the business of multiple elected Councils during this time, I can say categorically that the values and aspirations of the Mountain have been consistent for decades, and are evidenced in more recent times in many Community Plans and Blueprint consultations. I don't expect they will ever change in the coming decades unless we let our guard down.

It is a very strong argument that most of the Mountain's community of interest is with Gold Coast. This inevitably leads to a mismatch of aspirations and needs with those who govern us. The one-size-fits-all policy objective of the Scenic Rim has a heavy downside for the Mountain. We are profoundly different to the rest of the region in so many ways.

Let's hope that the Mountain's strong views that there should be no more policies, mechanisms or planning scheme amendments to increase our population, which is contrary to the SRRC'S views expressed in the Growth Management Study, is listened to, and acted upon.

#### **FOOD TOURISM**

Did you know that in Southeast Queensland we have scores of food trails? The question that is hardest to answer is what Council area in SEQ doesn't have any. If you are interested in this type of Tourism experience, you should visit the Council of Mayors' website, where you will find 51 trails listed, involving 490 businesses. See South East Queensland Food Trails - Home (seqfoodtrails.com.au). You will find details

there and on Council's own website of Scenic Rim's Eat Local Week.

#### **VALUATION OF LAND**

Everyone by now will have received their new land valuation in the mail which was dated as of 1st October 2021. Land values have increased for different categories and locations across the region. Tamborine Mountain's has gone up around 20%. This does not necessarily mean the General rate will go up by this amount. Setting the rate works in a backwards process. The defined amount of income desired is identified first in a budget, then the rate in the dollar is calculated to achieve this when calculated across all new valuations for all rateable properties. The largest impact is if the valuations in one area change relative to other areas. This could well see increases on Tamborine Mountain if any such increases are not compensated for by increasing the flat separate charge infrastructure for each property. Council still has other methods to delay the initial impacts of big swings in valuations by capping rates or averaging valuations.

#### **COUNCIL MEETINGS**

It is hoped that the media and public will soon be let back into the public gallery to observe and scrutinise in Council decision making, after the lifting of restrictions. There should be some announcements around this in coming weeks. It is a pillar of our democracy that Local Government decision making is open and transparent.

Like everyone, I am looking forward to some bright sunny days after several weeks of persistent nuisance rain. With the lifting of Covid restrictions, I am preparing to return to some Saturday morning face to face opportunities to meet with you in Main Street opposite the bakery. I'll keep you posted.

# CORE STRENGTH COULD HELP DOGS AVOID KNEE INJURIES



Agility and flyball dogs have proven to be more susceptible to cranial cruciate ligament rupture, according to Washington State University, in a study conducted earlier this year. This injury is similar to an ACL tear in humans. For 1,260 agility dogs studied, 260 tore the ligament, and 1,000 did not. Dogs training or competing in flyball were found to be in the highest risk of all activities: nearly 12% of dogs reported to play flyball ruptured a ligament.

The survey also confirmed some long-standing and well-accepted risk factors. In particular, female canines spayed before the age of one were almost twice as likely to rupture a ligament compared to dogs that were spayed after their first birthday – which places on the dog owner extra caution and responsibility ensuring there are no accidental pregnancies, yet it is important to develop strong ligaments in young animals.

It is speculated that the shape of a dog – and perhaps its tail – have some relevance when looking at knee injuries in dogs. Breeds like the Australian Shepherd and Labrador retrievers were more than twice as likely to rupture a ligament, while Rottweilers and Australian cattle dogs were more than four times as likely to tear a ligament. As with humans, being somewhat unfit then running over uneven surfaces, with stops and turns from time to time, present the greatest risk factors. Many of the dogs with cruciate ligament injuries in this survey were new to the sports and lacked core strength and general fitness. Surprisingly, dogs that competed more frequently at agility and flyball events were less likely to rupture a ligament.

#### What are some core strengthening exercises for dogs?

- Balance air cushions, large or small (just look online for dog fitness equipment).
- Plank walking, stepping backwards, side stepping, turning in a circle – left and right.
- Roll overs, from side to side and crawling.

There are probably more core strengthening exercises, but guiding your dog with treats and doing some or all of these regularly, and your dog will soon become proficient and stronger, reducing the risk of knee ligament injuries.

My husband and I decided to take advantage of a recent long weekend, taking off for a couple of days to explore our beautiful Scenic Rim. We had an awesome time visiting farms, climbing mountains and checking out overflowing dams. One of our stops was at a camel farm. The camels all had their own names, and each had a unique personality. We had the opportunity to go on a ride.

I was partnered with a curious camel by the name of Curly. The ride was at a very slow pace but even so, as Curly took off, I was unprepared for the rocking motion. I struggled to find my balance and hung on tight to the saddle. I admit feeling initial pangs of regret and wondered if I'd be able to hang on for the whole ride. I hoped I wouldn't be the first farm visitor to fall off, becoming a trampled heap on the ground! Of course, it didn't take long to adjust to the rocking, and a few minutes later it had morphed into a relaxing rhythm that was over all too soon.

Most of the new experiences we have in life can be similar to my camel ride with Curly. We start something new with a burst of enthusiasm. However, more often than not, it proves to be very different to our expectations. Doubts creep in and we wonder if we have made the right choice. We wonder if we should call it quits before we get in too deep. "I'm sorry Curly, it's all over. We're just not compatible – you're too much of a swinger for me!"

You may well laugh, but the serious side to this is that many relationships fail because of people's fear that they can't hold on. They cannot endure the turbulence that comes with the merging of lives and baggage. Of course, the exception being any form of violence, which should not be tolerated in any relationship. Most of our turbulences come because we are out of rhythm with one another and sometimes out of rhythm within ourselves. A close relationship guarantees to expose our insecurities.

# **NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT-SUBSIDY**

**PART 1 (0F 3)** 

Last year, Tamborine Mountain Rotary started an initiative to get public transport to the Mountain. The steering committee report has been lodged with the Department of Transport, and discussions between Rotary and the Department continue.

As part of that initiative, Rotary also investigated the transport options for patients on the Mountain who need to go and seek a medical service on the Gold Coast or in Brisbane. The results of this investigation are presented in this article, and in two consecutive articles in upcoming editions of the *Scenic News*.

Information was provided by Dr. Jan Zomerdijk and Neil Smith, Rotary.

Patients on Tamborine Mountain have essentially four subsidised options for travel to a medical facility or hospital on the Gold Coast:

- If the patient does not have access to private transport, then they can ask their treating doctor to arrange transport via Queensland Ambulance services (QAS) for Patient Transport services (PTS).
- If the patient can drive him or herself, or has someone to do that, then the PTSS (Patient Travel Subsidy Scheme) can contribute for a limited number of medical specialties at the Gold Coast, PA or Brisbane Hospitals.

- 3. Community Care can bring their members to medical appointments, mostly to the Gold Coast.
- 4. People with a disability may use an NDIS subsidy or the Taxi Subsidy Scheme (TSS). The Queensland Ambulance Service (QAS) might also be available for PTS for patients who require transport to or from medical appointments in a health care facility.

In general, the patient has to be assessed by their medical practitioner to assess whether or not the patient is eligible for any of these support systems.

In the next two editions of the *Scenic News* details will be provided about the aforementioned services and schemes.







## TRAVELLING PLACES with Gina

This morning I have been sorting a few things out at home... one of these is a table lamp that I bought in Spain many years ago; this I carried on my lap back home and have had ever since, and it reminds me of a wonderful holiday in Basque country.

Are you a souvenir shopper? I have friends who collect from all over the world. My mother collected beautiful glass paperweights. I am more of a collector of fairly substantial items! Although I do have a collection of hair clips from all over... Murano glass from Venice and Mdina glass from Malta probably vie for my most favourite.

As a young twenty-year-old travelling overland to Europe, my one purchase was a handmade rug in India - about 3m x 2m, and beautifully woven. Packaged up by the shop and posted to my address in London seemed sensible, rather than carrying it for months. The issue was that it didn't show up until two years after my trip to India, when I received notification of a parcel to collect. You can imagine my excitement... when I collected it, the rug had somehow shrunk to prayer mat size!

I was in the antique markets in Cairo and came across a chandelier I couldn't resist. From the Art Deco period and made of Lalique glass, the French colonial past of Egypt was reflected in this piece - to be honest it was something you instantly loved or hated. Made of wrought iron arms shaped as ivy leaves, with yellow glass trumpet flowers, it emanated a gentle light above my dining table.

As you walk through the back streets of Kathmandu, the carpet shop owners call to you; in I went sitting on the floor with a glass of Chai, as they rolled out carpet after carpet - when they flicked one carpet out, you can imagine my shock when two rats ran out!

Waiting for the ferry at Saint Malo in Northern France, I came across an optometrist with unique glasses frames how could I not be tempted?

My most recent purchase was in Azerbaijan in 2019, as yet again I was tempted. In Baku, wander the cobblestoned streets of the old town until you come across the Flying Carpet Shop under the tower. A treasure trove of beautiful





hand-woven carpets, made from hand-dyed wools from the regional villages, the craftmanship is exquisite. Expertly folded into a cube, I was lucky to have my son Hamish with me to carry my latest purchase!

In a remote village in PNG the villagers were weaving bags from handmade rope... I purchased a couple as a donation to the community. Australian customs wouldn't allow them into the country - apparently little mites and nasties live in the fabric.

On the other hand, herbs and spices from the markets in Avignon were OK to bring into Australia, and I still use them today when I cook. It is odd what is and isn't allowed, but I always happily declare anything I purchase as I return home.

# THE HISTORY OF PHYLLOXERA: "THE GREAT FRENCH WINE BLIGHT"

with Witches Falls Winery



There's nothing quite like a global pandemic to get people thinking about the science and history of disease. Over the last two years, we've all had to educate ourselves on everything from infection control to the basics of virology and epidemiology. Once upon a time these topics would have seemed niche—unimportant to your average Joe. But once COVID-19 became front and centre in our lives—affecting where we could go, who we could see, how we could spend our days— our thirst for information regarding the virus quickly became unquenchable. Cognisant of the fact that the COVID-19 pandemic will go down in the history books as one of the largest, most far-reaching pandemics in human history, it's interesting to compare our experiences of the COVID-19 pandemic with accounts of other plagues throughout history.

For winemakers, one particular plague has had a colossal impact on the shape of the modern wine industry—*Phylloxera*.

Although not posing a threat to humans, *Phylloxera* is a formidable foe when it comes up against *vitis vinifera*—aka the wine grape. Unlike COVID-19, *Phylloxera* isn't a virus, but rather a microscopic insect that feasts on the roots of grapevines. In the 19th century, this bug singlehandedly obliterated the majority of vineyards across Europe, causing a worldwide wine shortage and destroying the livelihoods of thousands of winemakers.

These tiny creatures secrete poison into the plant's roots and leaves, resulting in deformity and cutting grapes off from their water supply and other vital nutrients. To this day there is still no cure—most *Phylloxera* afflicted vines will eventually shrivel and die.

Indigenous to the Americas, *Phylloxera* was introduced to Europe in the mid 19th-century. While native American grapevine species have a level of immunity to *Phylloxera*, European species are highly susceptible. Once these tiny creatures landed on European soil, they spread through the continent like wildfire. Some estimate *Phylloxera* wiped out between 40-70% of all European vineyards within the span of a few decades, with France being particularly hard hit.

Mysteriously, a handful of vineyards were left untouched by the *Phylloxera* epidemic. Wines produced from these pure ancient grapes are still highly sought-after today, and come with a hefty price tag. Some argue that wine created from "self-rooted" vines taste better than those from grafted roots, although there is little evidence to back up this theory.

After "The Great French Wine Blight", most viticulturalists had to start over from scratch. Many grafted European grapevines onto American rootstock in an attempt to develop some resistance against the bug. This strategy worked for the most part, although there are still outbreaks of *Phylloxera* 

cropping up here and there. Having said this, some isolated wine-growing regions have managed to completely avoid contact with Phylloxera. Chile, as well as isolated parts of Australia (Tasmania and Western Australia) thanks to strict biosecurity and quarantine restrictions. An interesting consequence of the Phylloxera epidemic is that some of the world's oldest vines still producing grapes are right here in Australia, as opposed to their old-world homelands... who would have thought?

#### **AUTHENTIC LOUISIANA CHORIZO AND PRAWN GUMBO**

This slightly spicy, hearty dish, with plump ocean prawns and smokey chorizo, is surprisingly simple to make and will have everyone at the table saying 'mmmmmm, yum' whilst slurping it up in large spoonfuls.

This is a perfect dish to prepare at this time of year as the cooler nights creep in, because although it is wonderfully warming and rich, it will leave you feeling light and heartily refreshed. No need to go to the effort of making chicken stock for this recipe, as these days a high-quality storebought variety is a perfectly good substitute, or if needs be, you can even use a chicken stock cube.

Did you know? Gumbo is a thick dark stew or soup said to have derived from the word 'ki ngombo', which translates to 'okra' in many West African languages. The earliest recorded recipes for the dish include okra as a main ingredient, as okra and rice stews were common food staples of the early settlers to Louisiana. Devotees of okrabased gumbo love that sticky mouthfeel, as it thickens the gumbo and gives the stew body. This iconic dish has had many contributions from Native American, French. Spanish, and Caribbean people and has led to a fusion of culinary creativity that has all landed in one massive pot. The dish we know and love today is a source of culinary pride in Louisiana enjoyed by everyone.

Chef Dylan Tip: Do go to the effort of sourcing good quality prawns and chorizo, as doing so will make the dish a real stand out. Make sure to use risotto rice to give it the classic creamy mouthfeel of the okra. If you wanted to use normal rice, you could also thicken it with a classic roux of 30g butter and 30g flour.

#### **Downtown, Los Angeles 2018**

"A cup of gumbo please" I request from the white haired African American lady who is looking at me with gentle, deep, chestnutcoloured eyes. Without a word, she opens the lid of her cart and expertly ladles me a portion into a large Styrofoam cup and then places a plastic spoon on top of the cup, held in place with a small, delicate, timeravaged finger. Whilst passing it to me she says "T-ree dollars" with a thick Jamaican accent "Wud-ja like a lid?" she asks. "No thank you" I reply, taking the cup and spoon with one hand whilst handing over three crisp one-dollar notes into her outstretched hand. She takes them warily, seemingly suspicious as to why they look so new and fresh. "I just got them from the foreign

exchange" I stammer, somehow trying to convey genuinely that they are not counterfeit.

She quickly puts one to her nose and sniffs it; the scent seems to satisfy her, and she nods slightly, folds them over and places them in her jacket whilst simultaneously letting go of the cup. "Thank you", I say and turn, relieved to be now looking for the Union Station exit... a grand old iconic Los

Angeles landmark, and a vibrant symbol of downtown's renaissance architecture. It's also a dynamic destination for the arts, entertainment and culture. Union Station seems way more than a hustling, bustling transportation hub in the heart of the city—it's as if it's a gateway to culture.

Suddenly seeing a group of police walking towards me, dressed exactly like you see in the movies, with their sharp blue suits and special hat, I quip "Excuse me officers, I'm looking for the nearest exit. Can you point me in the right direction?" Obviously heading somewhere in a hurry, they simply ignore me and walk straight past me. I'm left standing there a little shocked and bemused but with steam still rising from the cup, I decide to turn left and then miraculously see the exit sign. I pass by huge glass windows like that of a church, and above me lurch large, exposed criss-crossed wooden beams showcasing the exquisite craftsmanship of the original builders, before finally strolling through the giant mosaic-tiled arched exit.

Upon exiting I come upon beautiful gardens, edged by towering Californian palm trees, slowly swaying in the foreground of a vast blue sky. I see the Californian flag blazed with a big brown bear, flapping in the gentle breeze. I spy some seating and instantly decide that here is the perfect place to enjoy one of my favourite pastimes, simply watching people go about their lives. I sit quietly sipping my now perfectly warm gumbo, awed by the fact I'm really here in LA. I pinch myself, the pain reminding me: no, this is not some fantastical dream.

This really is a simple and delicious way to add a little culture to your weekend meals, so go on, give it a go.

Serves 2-4 Prep Time 10mins Cook Time15 mins



#### Ingredients

- 1 carrot, chopped into cubes
- 1 red onion, chopped 2cm cubes
- · 4 garlic cloves, diced finely
- 1 green capsicum, chopped into 2 cm cubes
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme leaves
- Few sprigs of parsley, stalks and leaves separated
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 chorizo, halved & sliced 2cm cubes
- 50a butter
- 3 tablespoons Creole\*
- 1L chicken stock/broth
- 2 cups water
- 2/3 cup risotto rice
- 12 fresh banana prawns, peeled and deveined

\*Chef Dylan's Gourmet Food Co. Creole marinade

#### Method


- Heat oil in saucepan over high heat.
   Cook chorizo for 3 mins stirring.
- Turn heat to medium add butter, veggies and gently fry for ~7 minutes.
- Add Creole seasoning, cook for 1 minute, stirring.
- 4. Add stock and water. Cover with lid and bring to boil.
- 5. Turn heat to low, add rice to saucepan and stir to combine.
- 6. Cover with a lid and simmer for 10 minutes until rice is almost tender, stirring occasionally.
- Add prawns. Cook for 3/4 minutes until just cooked.

#### To serve

Ladle gumbo into serving bowls and garnish with chopped parsley and thyme leaves.


James Patterson, the author of Alex Cross and Women's Murder Club series. was the first-ever writer to exceed one million sales in ebooks.

James Patterson achieved the one million mark in July 2010. Later that month, Amazon announced that Patterson's competitor - Stieg Larsson - has also sold over one million digital copies in his Millennium trilogy, making him the first one to sell more than 1 million paid Kindle books and enter Amazon's exclusive Kindle Million Club.

The first generation Kindle, released on 19 November 2007, was sold out in only 5 1/2 hours.

The first-ever Kindle cost \$399, and after it was sold out it remained out of stock for five months until late April 2008. With its 250 MB of internal storage, it could hold approximately two hundred non-illustrated titles at a time. It also had a speaker and a headphone jack for listening to audio files.






