



### AND... THEY'RE OFF ON THE GOAT TRACK

Nearly 600 days ago, Tamborine Mountain Road (known locally as the Goat Track) was lost as a vital connection between Tamborine Mountain and Canungra after being

closed by a huge landslip in December 2020. Earlier this week, it was re-opened to through traffic (as of midday, Monday 1 August 2022).

### THE WELLCAMP 'WHITE ELEPHANT' QUARANTINE CENTRE

Last week I mentioned the \$40 million wasted on 12 people's hotel quarantine costs by this Government – a huge waste of \$3.3 million per person, uncovered by the LNP in carrying out our job of holding this Government to account. In doing so, I mentioned only briefly the reported cost of the Wellcamp Quarantine Facility near Toowoomba that was supposed to end all hotel quarantine (it didn't, but that's another story).

I say "reported" because, at that time, the Government was still refusing to detail the actual costs, citing dodgy "commercial in confidence" reasons for keeping Queenslanders in the dark. Fast forward to this week, and things have changed. We saw the Auditor-General announce in Parliament last week, following requests from David Crisafulli and the LNP, that they were launching an investigation into this facility and its cost, and then on Wednesday last week the Deputy Premier swallowed hard and read a statement to Parliament that lays out the \$238 million cost of Wellcamp (it could yet be more). I was there and couldn't believe he was actually doing it — after both he and the Premier claimed for nearly a year that it was "commercial in confidence." What changed? And so quickly? Was it a sudden change of heart? A pang of conscience?

This Government cares more about how things look than how they actually are, and I've no doubt this sudden turn of accountability is more about trying to end the negative stories than anything else. The Auditor-General will now examine this project, which never went to open tender, and which gave the Wagner family (that's who will own it — the State is only leasing it right now) a 1000-bed facility paid for by Queenslanders. The Auditor-General will examine the operations of a facility where only about 700 people have stayed. The average cost per stay is well over \$300,000 per quarantine visit, an amount which I can't find words to describe. It's just unspeakably bad value. The Government cannot claim this cost will come down in the long-term - because Queenslanders don't own it, so there is no long-term when it comes to this white elephant. Back in the 80s, Kerry Packer said you only get one Alan Bond in your lifetime when he sold a network to Bondy and then bought it back for less than what he sold it for. Let's hope, for Queensland's sake, that there's only one "Alan Bond" in government for a very, very long time.

This waste of money is criminal, and more so in the face of this Government penny-pinching on so many essential items — like school bus routes for our kids in Scenic Rim Electorate, on road maintenance on the Mountain and the despicable road known as Beaudesert Nerang Road, on National Park maintenance and hospital services across Queensland. We must do better to bring the best future for everybody. We must end this era of waste and dereliction of duty by Labor in Queensland.

There would be hundreds of similar situations, if not more, for people who live around Canungra and Tamborine Mountain, and I know people will be very happy to see it open again.

It's been a long haul since the road was closed, and I thank you all for your patience. It was hard and sometimes dangerous work to fix the road. Appreciate the abseiling skills of the workers who put in the steel rods, and who made safe the dozens of rocks that had to be removed from the hill, some weighing hundreds of tonnes.

# **EXHIBITION THAT ILLUSTRATES THE ENDURING CHALLENGE OF CHANGE**

The constancy of change and the capacity of individuals to respond to its challenges is explored in Scenic Rim Regional Council's next exhibition, *Enduring*.

Combining two sensitive exhibitions, *Nature of Change* by Bonny Shore and *Imagined Worlds* – inside out by Janine Healy, *Enduring* will be opened at The Centre Beaudesert on Saturday 20 August by Scenic Rim Mayor Greg Christensen.

"Both artists' works offer unique perspectives of human emotion, identity and resilience in the face of extreme personal change, both physical and environmental," he said.

"We live in a rapidly changing world and the underlying theme of the *Enduring* exhibition, which celebrates our resilience and capacity to cope, is that the only constant in life is change.

"Through two very different exhibitions, using materials as diverse as textiles and x-ray films and techniques including embroidery and laser-cut timber

collage, we see the artists' responses to the challenge of change in their own lives and in the world around them."

Scenic Rim artist Janine Healey has taken self-portraiture into another dimension, combining x-ray films overlaid with images and paintings of landscapes and plants to consider the internal and external environments.

Some 30 years of medical procedures, including a two-level spinal fusion, left her with 'a mountain of imaging' in the form of x-ray films and CT scans and a fascination for science which has enabled her to move, change, adapt and grow.

Through a physical and emotional journey, Janine became intrigued by the mechanics of the structure of pedicle screws, wire cages and bone grafts embedded within her and how quickly these foreign objects became one with her 'frame'.

"It revealed to me, too, how nature adapts and takes over, and I was reminded of seeing trees engulf fence posts and barbed wire and how saplings often swallow up the supports that assisted their growth," she said.

"This series of portraits tastefully explores the artist from the inside out. It's a story of survival, of partnering with science for a positive outcome."

Beaudesert-born artist Bonny Shore has also experienced a life of changes, beginning with her family's move from the Scenic Rim to Wynnum, overlooking Moreton Bay, after which she spent 20 years in outback Queensland, where her children were born.

After many years in tropical Queensland, she has returned to the Scenic Rim area of northern New South Wales and, through her work, has established her identity as a carer, partner, professional, creative woman and artist.

"As a springboard from domestic, utilitarian stitching - once part of the female 'Domestic Sciences'



 I work primarily with textiles and print, layering fabrics and papers to create artworks, stitched with motifs about identity, journey, place, and current environmental changes, searching for answers and theories," Bonny said

"Art, like science, seeks meaning, answers, and solutions to the questions of life and change.

"My intention is for others to consider identity and place, and seek solutions to changes in their own lives and place, society, and the wider environment."

Members of the Scenic Rim community are invited to the free exhibition launch event on Saturday 20 August, which includes morning tea from 10.30am, and to meet the artists who will be sharing insights into their works.

The free *Enduring* exhibition runs from Saturday 20 August until Saturday 15 October and is open from Tuesday to Friday from 10am to 4pm and Saturday from 10am to 2pm, excluding public holidays.

"Enduring continues the theme of our thought-provoking 2022 cultural program, understanding our world through arts and science, and I look forward to welcoming the community at the official launch," Mayor Christensen said.



## FIGHT OR FLIGHT - HOW IS YOUR PSOAS?

We've been working on releasing our psoas muscles this week in yoga class. And the whole-body nature of yoga goes beyond the stretch – releasing your psoas muscles often means letting go of old fears, traumas and life patterns that can keep you stuck in a perpetual state of flight or flight.

So, what are the psoas muscles and why are they interesting? Well, your psoas connects your lumbar spine to your inner thighs by running through your hip joint. This connection between your back and your legs enables you to run and kick, the two primary functions that we need in fight or flight mode. When your nervous system senses that you are in danger, it alerts your psoas, and you become ready to run away from that predator or to fight it off. And the neural connection between your brain and your muscles is a two-way street: as the brain tells the psoas to fire up, the flexed psoas sends neural messages to the brain asking for support, and your nervous system fires out cortisol and adrenaline. You experience an increased heart rate, slowed digestion and a burst of energy. Pretty useful in caveman days when hunting for food was a life-threatening adventure, daily.

The real drama with the psoas muscle is that your caveman body regards much of modern life stressors as threatening as the predators of old. So, the horrible boss, the road rage maniac, the negative media channels pumping out visuals of horrors way beyond our control, trigger the same response in our bodies as did that tiger chasing us. Hence for many people, their psoas muscles are in a constant state of flexion (activation) and their bodies are in a constant state of fight or flight. The long-term effect of an activated psoas can result in hip pain and back pain. A tight psoas can also affect your breathing. The diaphragm and the psoas connect along the same vertebrae in the lower spine – so when the psoas is tight, we are unable to fully extend our diaphragm and take a full breath. Short, shallow breaths (as opposed to long, slow breaths) also keep your body in a constant state of fight or flight.

This is where modalities like yoga and long held introverted stretches can really help. Not just stretching the psoas, but breathing into the psoas muscles and letting go, either consciously or unconsciously, the longheld stress you might be holding in this muscle. Opening the body equates to opening the mind. As you learn to release the psoas and unpack all the dramas around those tight muscles, so too will it become easier to cultivate the qualities of patience, trust, and compassion for your body and your life.

It becomes problematic when we search for the delightful, expecting that we will find it in the easy experiences of life. We judge a relationship on whether it is easy sailing, meeting our needs and fulfilling our desires. When it becomes hard work, we are disappointed because our expectations were not met. We begin believing that the grass is greener in another paddock. However, the reality is that tending the other paddock comes with the same hard work.

It's a myth that finding a great relationship is like finding a treasure box full of everything we have longed for: companionship, intimacy, romance, affirmation. Every relationship starts as an empty box. You must put something in before you can take something out. It requires hard work to fill the box: a commitment to giving, serving, praising, encouraging, patience, apologies, forgiveness. It takes mutual effort from both parties for the box to be filled. Easy Street is not where you find flourishing relationships. They are forged in the challenges and messiness of life.

# PHYSIQUE 5

### **WE'LL HELP YOU FIGURE IT OUT**

I think the most common thing
I hear in the clinic is "I must be
getting old". A couple of months
ago I found myself thinking and
saying the same thing. You see, I
properly twinged my lower back and
found myself defaulting to this way

of thinking, that my joints and muscles weren't feeling as good or keeping up with what I was doing as much as they used to. The truth is this injury has nothing to do with getting old and mine was most likely (definitely) the result of over enthusiastic sciatic nerve stretches, helping Hayden do heavy dump runs followed by shoveling and wheelbarrowing loads of gravel. In fact, 85% of people will experience this injury at some point. Although maybe not by doing something that silly, realistically I am doing well to get this far without experiencing any significant pain or injuries.

When people come to see a physio, we get them to describe what they are feeling. This is always very interesting, and we get some amazing descriptors. Countless times I've heard people describe a toothache in their back when they're trying to sleep, catching electric pain into a leg and sensations like ants crawling over their skin. When I tweaked my back, I was experiencing these things myself and initially I found it interesting to relate to pains and sensations I have had described to me so many times. Physios are weird like that. Overall, I felt prepared to deal with it. Lucky for me I work in the perfect place and knew I needed to manage it with a bit of rest, some hands-on treatment and lots of heat.

What I wasn't prepared for was the feelings of disheartenment and frustration when it wasn't improving as fast as I wanted. I kept trying to do things that my body wouldn't allow. Despite my experience as a physio, I kept pushing too hard, too fast and re-tweaking my pain. All I could see was the things I couldn't do like running and gardening. I knew that normally, healing timeframes for pain to settle with an injury like this is 4-6 weeks, but I thought I could accelerate it. Surprise, surprise, I had to learn the lesson a lot of our patients learn, to stop and rest then gently work my way back to movement and exercise. I could so easily see how this doesn't happen and with the feelings of disheartenment and frustration and a lack of knowledge of what to do with it can easily end up in a cycle of tweak, pain, anger, tweak, pain, anger. This is why it is very

easy to throw your hands up and fall back on something you will have heard over and over - "I must be old now, I guess I can't run anymore because I have a bad back".

Overall, this experience has made me a much better physio. I can relate to patients on a deeper level. When I hear "I must be getting old" I can better understand the feelings of disheartenment and frustration. When I see similar presentations, I know what's worked for me, what doesn't work and how to wade through frustrations relating to return to exercise or sport or gardening.

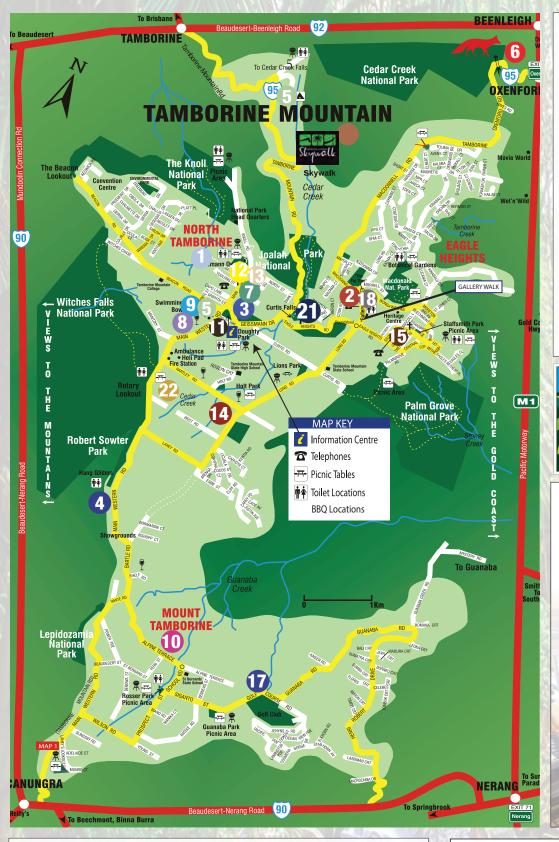

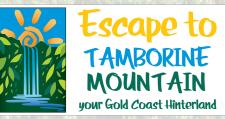

### **DESIGNING WITH INTENTIONALITY**

We all know what it is like to have a conversation with someone genuinely engaged and present in the moment. They look you in the eyes; there is a mutual asking of questions and a responding with feedback to the discussed topics. It produces memorable moments of intimacy, setting benchmarks for future interaction.

In life's busyness, it is essential to slow down and make the most of these moments when they arise.

I believe that there is a way design can facilitate these special events.

In a recent project for a repeat client, this was taken to new levels I had previously not considered nor anticipated.

My client and friend was sadly

diagnosed with cancer during the design process. Such circumstances tend to cause us to reflect and adjust. As a designer, I believe it is the height of honour to consider how one's environment could facilitate such a dramatic change in personal conditions. There is a paradigm shift of sorts that takes place. It involves paring back to meaningful essentials that force us to reflect on the momentary.

What could that look like? To me, it is about creating space that offers two distinct outcomes.

- 1. Encourages memorable human interaction
- 2. Facilitating moments of peaceful reflection

In my opinion, the first is about crafting space that gently encourages togetherness. This might translate as a firepit



surrounded by fixed seating or providing a sunken indoor living area pointing one to another.

The second is inherently sensory. It is about feeling the breeze, experiencing the warmth of the winter sun, enjoying the way light is filtered through leaves, and capturing views through the framing architecture can provide.

Making allowances for such things means continual enjoyment is found within the memory of the moment.

It is not about trying to force circumstances, but rather allowing for them to happen organically. It facilitates future experiences that I will never be privy to but have been allowed for in the humblest of ways.

### **JAPANESE-STYLE GINGER PORK**

This traditional Japanese dish with thin slices of pork has fragrant garlic, ginger and soy sauce which is not only good for your immunity but incredibly delicious. This quick and easy dish is an excellent way to introduce a different global cuisine into your cooking répertoire and can be prepared and ready in just 15 minutes

Pronounced (Shoga-Yaki) shoga means ginger, and yaki means grill or fry; it is one of Japan's most popular pork dishes, right up there with Tonkatsu or crispy fried pork cutlets.

You may have to ask the butcher for this cut of pork loin, as it is often used for short cut bacon. All good butchers who make their own bacon will be more than happy to reserve this cut for you. I've made this dish super easy by using my Luck Dragon Asian sauce which saves you having to make your own. The caramelised garlic, sesame and

The caramelised garlic, sesame and fresh lemon really elevate the flavours of the pork, which combined with the soy and ginger make for a delicious dish.

Did you know? Indigenous Japanese have an early history of consuming wild caught meat, but when the philosophy of Buddhism became established among the ruling class of Japan, the vegetarian preferred diet led to the idea of shunning of meat. For over 1000 years there were even periodic bans on meat consumption. It's only since Japan opened up to the West 150 years ago that slowly things began to change, and meat consumption started to be widely accepted again in Japan, and pork has been a relatively affordable favourite.

Chef Dylan tips: Ask the butcher to slice the pork in 5 mm slices for you so you get nice even slices. The pan needs to be nice and hot to get that nice colour on the meat, but it only needs to colour on one side as the pork loin is so thin. It can over cook very easily so be careful.

#### Osaka, Southern Japan 2004

Sitting beneath the old cherry blossom tree, I slowly open my eyes, gently coming back from the meditative state I've spent the last hour in. A strange new enchanting world begins to come into focus, and a delicate pink cherry blossom flower catches my attention as it gently floats towards the ground, loosened by the cool breeze that now has a litter of leaves swirling in the hotel carpark. I glance at my watch; 11:05 am, perfect. I intentionally skipped

breakfast at the hotel this morning as I want to try the shogayaki set at a local hole-in-the-wall-style restaurant the concierge at the reception highly recommended. Reaching into my jacket pocket, I carefully unfold the detailed hand-drawn mud map he had given to me the night before.

Making my way down the street, I come to the main part of town. The wide road is flanked on both sides by cream and grey coloured ten storey apartment-style buildings linked by a myriad electrical wires like giant spider webs crisscrossing between them. Adorned on the sides are multi-coloured advertisements in block Japanese characters that confuddle my mind. The sidewalk is peppered with welldressed Japanese workmen, little old ladies and the occasional American tourist garbed in a garishly bright tee shirt and sandals with socks. The air is thick with the smell of tobacco and exhaust fumes. Looking down at my map I'm relieved to see the restaurant is just a few metres ahead.

White illuminated lanterns hang outside the restaurant like cocoons between a navy-blue banner that matches the characters on my map. A small fish tank filled with prawns and shellfish sits on a wooden crate next to a large, brightly lit window, showing photos of all sorts of exotic dishes with beautiful calligraphy and a photo of a smiling Japanese girl holding a massive bottle of sake. Next to the door sits a rack for your umbrella, above it are cane-looking baskets and what look like some sort of primitive traditional straw skirts. I enter and see it's tiny inside with only 10 stools dotted underneath a long bar. The patrons are all men dressed exactly the same, with white collared shirts and jet-black trousers. They all seem to know each other, as they all turn in unison as I pull out the last remaining stool. Seemingly uninterested in me, they go back to talking and joking with each other. The neatly dressed barman, dressed in all black, has his shirt unbuttoned casually and asks in perfect English "Menu sir"? "No need," I reply, "Can I order the shogayaki meal set please?" " Certainly sir."

If you like Japanese food and you're willing to give this recipe a shot, you'll have yourself a full-blown Japanese umami bomb indeed. So, why not go ahead and get some pork on your fork. Shogayaki is usually served with rice,



thinly shredded cabbage and miso soup to make it a meal set. If you want to make the shredded cabbage, just trim the stems from the tender inner leaves of a head of cabbage and then roll them up and use a sharp knife to cut the cabbage into thin threads.

### Serves 2 – Prep 10 mins – Cook 5 mins

#### Ingredients

- 300g pork loin, thinly sliced
- 2 tbs oil
- 1 tbs butter
- 3 tbs Luck dragon Asian sauce\*
- 1 tbs ginger, finely grated
- 1/2 small brown onion, sliced
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1/4 small cabbage, sliced thinly

\*Chef Dylan's Gourmet Food Co. Luck Dragon Asian sauce

#### Method

- 1. In a small bowl mix the grated ginger and Luck Dragon sauce to combine.
- Heat oil in a non-stick frypan over medium high heat until smoking
- 3. Place the meat in the frypan without overlapping (cook in batches if required) and cook for about 1-2 minutes or until the bottom side is nice and golden. Only cook one side.
- 4. If cooking in batches, transfer the cooked meat onto a plate and fry the remaining meat and remove to a plate.
- Reduce the heat to medium. Add butter and melt, then sizzle the onion and cook for 2 mins stirring to soften.
- Return all the cooked meat to the frypan and add the Luck Dragon Asian sauce to the pan.
- Cook for about 15-30 seconds, turning the pork slices over to ensure the meat is coated with the sauce. When the sauce is reduced to about 1-2 tablespoons, turn the heat off.
- 8. Serve with rice and sliced cabbage and drizzle sauce over the pork.




