NEW DATA REVEALS HEALTH WARNING FOR AUSTRALIANS WORKING FROM HOME

Workspace Week is 22-28 August 2022 - Work Well From Anywhere!

The Australian Chiropractors Association (ACA) has launched Workspace Week (22-28 August), with the release of alarming statistics prompting a health warning urging Australians to correct their poorly set up home workspaces to avoid any physical injuries that may be caused by unsafe workspace practices.

Due to living with COVID-19 for the past three years, the majority of Australians have worked in hybrid settings shared between home and office locations, with new data revealing they may be risking their health by not working in ergonomically correct workspaces.

Dr David Cahill, chiropractor and President of the ACA said, "With more Australians working from home than ever before, those using computers at home who are not correctly set up in an ergonomic workspace, may be risking their spinal health and overall wellbeing.

"While a by-product of the pandemic has seen working from home become normalised, the results of our recent surveys show alarming statistics that many Australians are yet to adjust to this 'new normal' and may be risking their health because they haven't adopted safe work habits at home."

To gauge the impact on the health of people who've been working remotely since the pandemic began, in April 2022 the ACA commissioned a national survey with questions relating to working from home.

Of the 1,003 adult respondents nationally, more than one third (34%) of Australians said they'd been working from home with the majority (70%) planning to continue to do so, even after restrictions lifted.

Many of those working from home reported they worked at their dining table (33%), 16% worked from bed and 15% worked from their sofa rather than at a desk; while 67% reported that since working from home the hours spent working at their computers had increased.

Based on these findings, ACA conducted a second national survey, this time among ACA chiropractors to learn the impact the lack of working in non-ergonomically correct workspaces is having on patients.

The results were alarming, revealing that a large number of Australians are putting their health at risk due to home workspaces not being set up correctly.

Dr Cahill said, "Through national Workspace Week we aim to educate Australians about the importance of postural correctness in an ergonomic workspace environment so they can work well from anywhere.

"Implementing positive spinal health habits including using an ergonomic office chair, adjusting your laptop to eye level; and positioning your knees slightly below your hips when sitting, are all important factors in preventing spinal injuries when working from anywhere," said Dr Cahill.

"To minimise serious health risks to their spine, neck, and lower back and to maintain overall health and wellbeing, we're urging the hundreds-of-thousands of Australians working from home to get moving and download our recently developed free resources.

"The Workspace Checklist can assist people to work safely in an ergonomic setting, while using the Straighten Up app to improve posture, stabilise core muscle groups, prevent spinal disability and enhance their overall health and wellbeing."

"Those experiencing pain and those concerned about their spinal health when working from home or in other hybrid settings, should consider a chiropractor for professional advice.

Your local ACA chiropractor can help you better manage workspace ergonomics so you can take control of your spinal health as well as provide exercise programs specific to your needs," said Dr Cahill.



TUSSOCK MOTH CATERPILLAR

- Olene sp. garage, Central Avenue.



Tussock moths are so-named because of their hairy larvae. They belong to the sub-family Lymantriinae of the family Erebidae, which is among the largest families of moths. Many tussock moth species are pests, either because they are destructive to shade and forest trees, or because they have stinging hairs. The expert thought the caterpillar was of the genus Olene, which has 10 known species occurring in India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Thailand and Australia. The location of the photo is ideally suited to show the hair pencils on the caterpillar's head and tail, a distinguishing characteristic only found on a few species.

HELP MONITOR PLATYPUS IN THE ALBERT RIVER



Watergum PlatypusWatch has been monitoring platypus populations for the past 12 years and after discovering evidence of platypus DNA in the Albert River, extended their reach to include the Logan area. Platypus are one of Australia's most iconic species and with help from the community, we can monitor their activity and keep track of their populations.

It's currently platypus mating season, the busiest time of the year for platypus and the best time for platypus monitoring. The community is invited to join our PlatypusWatch community and come along to our next Albert River Survey on September 17th. Volunteers will first be treated to a catered information evening that will teach them everything they need to know about these unique creatures and how to survey them, before we set you up in one of our survey sports to monitor their behaviours and assess the health of their habitat.

If volunteers are interested they register for the PlatypusWatch Induction on Tuesday August 30th.

FOR TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN

Works between Curtis Road and Tamborine Mountain Shopping Square commenced in late April 2022 and were expected to take 6 weeks to complete. Main Roads has advised that wet weather meant these works were delayed. Works are now expected to be completed by September 2022.

Nightworks from 6pm to 6am, Sunday to Thursday started in August.

Works will be done in two sections.

- Section 1: Rehabilitation works on Geissmann Drive 400m from the Tamborine Mountain Shopping Square
- Section 2: Resealing works on Geissmann Drive for a further 280m starting from the end of these rehabilitation works, to just before Curtis Road intersection (expected to complete later in 2022)

TAMBORINE-OXENFORD ROAD AT HOWARD CREEK

Main Roads has advised that for three weeks from 18 August, all traffic lanes will be moved to the northern side of the work zone on Tamborine-Oxenford Road at Howard Creek (the finished road surface on the new culverts). The changes are to enable construction of the southern traffic lane

One set of traffic signals controlling movements from Oxenford will be temporary moved closer to the culverts. There may be some intermittent use of 'stop and go' traffic control during vegetation removal on the southern side of Tamborine-Oxenford Road.

The speed limit in all work areas will remain at 40km/h during working hours and 60km/h at all other times. Travel delays can be expected. These changes are for the safety of motorists and road workers, and to enable works to proceed as efficiently as possible.



POTENTIAL GAME CHANGER

This is a very different letter to those I usually write about local matters. This one reports a breakthrough in science that should result in great benefits for us all. Our son, Professor Phil, has had a long and notable career in medical research and academia in his chosen field of molecular biology. When he suddenly says he is a little old and jaded but he can still be amazed by something really significant, I sit up and take notice. My enlightenment about this real game changer is generally as below.

Proteins (not just the dietary sort) play a fundamental role in our functioning in our internal and external environments. You are reading this letter via light sensitive proteins in your retina while hoping your vaccine shots (more protein



involvement) will protect you from Covid. Human bodies make something over 30,000 different proteins!

Proteins are strings of hundreds or thousands of amino acids. There are twenty types of amino acids that differ in their properties. The order of the amino acids in a protein is specified by a gene. Now the bit that makes it very difficult for researchers: first trick: the two-dimensional string folds up into a complex three-dimensional structure; second trick: the shape of the structure depends on how the multitude of its amino acids interact with each other. Third trick: It is the protein's shape which determines the protein's biological function in mediating chemical reactions such as breaking down your food during digestion or forming a physical structure such as hair or fingernails. Understanding structure is central to a great deal of biomedical research, including drug design. Structure determination has limited the pace of research because, until now, this required very timeconsuming and expensive lab work.

THE YORKSHIRE TERRIER DOG

Known as the "Yorkie", this breed is small in size, but big in personality. One of the smallest breeds of terriers, weighing no more than 15.4 kilograms. There are about 31 recognised terrier breeds, which fall into toy, small and medium size categories. Terrier dogs were originally bred and trained to be hunters



in the 18th century. Surprisingly, these dogs and other terrier breeds are still used by some Australian Councils as rodent control, visiting over a thousand homes and businesses every year.

History – during the industrial revolution in England, workers went to Yorkshire to work in coal mines, textile mills and factories. Rats became a big problem and various types of terrier dogs were bred smaller to chase, pursue and corner their prey.

Positive aspects of this breed include:

- They are suitable for living in apartments, needing little to moderate exercise.
- Smart and receptive to training, outgoing and playful.
- Affectionate and loyal to family members.
- They make good home alarm systems, alerting about anyone approaching.
- Longevity, a lifespan up to 16 years.

Negative aspects about this breed include:

- They can be 'yappy', barking at every sound, and prone to separation anxiety.
- Not recommended for households with toddlers or small children because of their small and delicate size.
- Yorkies think they are big and may try to start a fight with bigger dogs, socialising at an early age is recommended.
- This breed tends to retain puppy teeth, especially canines, which can contribute to tooth decay.
- Like many small dogs, they can be troublesome when spoilt, requiring set limits and training.

Yorkie Doodle Dandy is a book about Smokey, a tiny Yorkshire terrier found in New Guinea during WWII, she helped to save the lives of servicemen by transporting a communications cable through a small drainage tunnel. She then went on to be the first known therapy dog, visiting soldiers in a military hospital.

Never buy a puppy online or from a pet shop. Instead look for a reputable breeder who tests dogs to make sure they are free of genetic diseases and that puppies have sound temperaments.

If you've ever travelled through Italy, you've likely seen a creation by Michelangelo, the most revered sculptor of the Renaissance period. Michelangelo began life from humble beginnings. As a young child his mother was sick and eventually died, and he was brought up in the home of a stone cutter. His amazing natural talent led to his acceptance into an elite school of sculpting. His crooked nose was a reminder of this period where he became arrogant and criticised his fellow colleagues' efforts, resulting in an offended student breaking his nose. It was a lesson in humility that Michelangelo never forgot.

As he grew in reputation and wisdom, he no longer saw himself as the creator of the statue. He said "In every block of marble I see a statue as plain as though it stood before me, shaped and perfect in attitude and action. I have only to hew away the rough walls that imprison the lovely apparition to reveal it to others' eyes as I see it." He believed that the statue lay hidden in the block of marble and his task was to clear away the superfluous matter and remove the rubbish.

Michelangelo was also a painter. His most famous work adorns the ceiling of the Sistine chapel. He said that while sculpture is made by taking away, painting is made by adding. Two very different processes that lead to something beautiful. Life often intimates art, as Oscar Wilde tells us. Perhaps we can learn from the artistic processes of taking away and adding to create a thing of beauty.

In everyday life we have opportunities to add beauty. See yourself as an artistic contributor to the culture around you. What is your contribution to the culture in your workplace, home, school or wherever you find yourself? We can have vision like Michelangelo, seeing the potential beauty hidden under the visible chaos. Like a sculptor, we can assess what doesn't belong there: criticism, grudges, judgement, defensiveness. Michelangelo learnt the hard way that criticism is part of the superfluous which gets in the way of beauty and leaves a lasting impact. Sculpting requires patience as it takes much time to slowly chisel away at the unwanted and sometimes harmful debris. You might recognise something in another person that doesn't belong: frustration, pain, anger. Rather than reacting and reinforcing that which is covering up the beauty inside, find a way to alleviate their distress.

Like painters, we can add our personal touches to our culture. These can take the form of encouragement, kindness, a listening ear or a helping hand. You might think you have little to offer when it comes to contributing to culture, but every one of us has our own sphere of influence that we rarely acknowledge. Young eyes that look to you, neighbours, relatives, colleagues, the person who serves you coffee; all are impacted by your responses to them. Brighten their day by adding a pleasant experience and bringing out the beauty inside.

Then, along came the English artificial intelligence company, DeepMind, with software, AlphaFold. DeepMind is owned by Google's parent company Alphabet. DeepMind has now freely published the predicted structures of about 200 million proteins including most of those in the human body. These are highly accurate predictions which approach the accuracy of lab-based structure determinations. Doing what Artificial Intelligence does best, it had reviewed about 180,000 experimental results and drawn some conclusions. These demonstrated how the sequence of amino acids in the string determines the folding, and therefore the critical final structure. That is far beyond the capability of the human brain. This has already saved enormous time and cost in progressing biomedical research.

The capability is already of value in programs as diverse as finding solutions for problems such as protection against malaria, coping with bacteria resistant to antibiotics and treating plastic waste.

Humans have made a new tool, and it is a game changer.

TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN ROAD – A PROJECT UPDATE

I am concerned about the lack of communication with Dep't Transport and Main Roads and the local community regarding our road upgrade planned for Geissmann Drive – Main Western Road.

This road is already problematic on days where access into Main Street, (the Business Centre) from Main Western Road (the busiest tourist route across the Mountain) creates a bottleneck.

There was an incident where traffic coming into Main Street (for a street fair), upon finding nowhere to park and trying to exit again into traffic coming up to the markets, had vehicles backed up to the bottom of the Mountain.

This situation has been raised many times over the years. Two suggestions have been made:

One is a roundabout at the entrance to Main Street, the other is a new section of road cutting across from the end of Beacon Road and joining up with Geissmann Drive behind the Information Centre, with a roundabout at the end of Beacon Road.

This new section of road would avoid the need for constant re-patching of old road patches which has occurred on this old section of road for some time now.

Who is responsible for communicating local issues to the Dep't of Transport and Main Roads?

This situation is not going to improve with increased tourist traffic and an increase in population.

We need to be involved in the plans, as we live here, and it is our money being spent here. We know the problems. Why can't we be allowed to have a say?

NEW SPEED CAMERAS COMING TO QLD SCHOOL, ROADWORKS ZONES

The Queensland government will shortly begin rolling out new hi-tech cameras in school zones and roadworks zones across the state

It comes in response to Queensland's worsening road toll with 193 killed on state roads so far this year - 15 more than at the same time last year.

The new cameras will be deployed to high-risk areas from September. Transport and Main Roads Minister Mark Bailey said "I'm pleased to announce that new cameras will target speeding drivers in both school and roadworks zones to keep Queensland kids and workers safe.

"I don't want to see another road worker killed or someone's child badly injured on their way to school just because of the recklessness of a speeding driver."

The cameras will be different between roadwork zones and school zones. Motorists are warned they may not even notice the cameras operating near schools.

Roadwork zones will be manned by solar-powered cameras on a robotlike mobile platform that can be manoeuvred around the work site. Cameras in school zones will be more discreet and will be mostly attached to road signs.

More than 70,000 motorists have been caught speeding in school

zones across Queensland since 2018.

More than 12,500 Queenslanders were fined for speeding through 40km/h school zones last year.

This July, speeding penalties were increased: with motorists going between 1 and 10km/h over the limit.hit with a \$287 fine and one demerit point. The penalty for going between 11 and 20 km/h over the limit is now \$431 and three demerit points.

If you can't make it to Sunset Sips—fear not. We've pulled together a few recommendations of varieties absolutely perfect for spring sipping. Keep these in mind to level up your evening drinks game at home.

When the nights still hold a little chill in the air, a red wine will warm from the inside out. Lambrusco is perfect for spring because it tends to be medium-bodied, fruit forward, and is often (but not always) made in a semi-sparkling style. It is often avoided due to its reputation for being a cheap, soft-drink-adjacent boxed wine in years gone by. Today however, many winemakers are producing **Lambrusco** in a more traditional Italian style. Most Lambrusco on the market today is dry, textural, and multi-dimensional, often displaying beautiful notes of blackberry, violet, and spices. What's not to love?

Orange wine is another Spring go-to. Think of it as the cool aunt of rosé. Orange wine is not made from oranges but has a beautiful golden-amber colour that arises from extended grape-skin contact. Orange wine can be made from any white wine grape and tends to display notes of citrus-blossom, honey, peaches, and marmalade!

When it comes to white wine, I've been loving **Arinto**. This zesty, citrusy white is made for long lunches and pairs beautifully with

seafood, salads, and grilled spring vegetables. Perfectly crisp and bright, Arinto will cool you down on a warm day without sacrificing complexity of flavour—alongside citrus and stone fruit, this variety often displays subtle notes of honey, herbs, white flowers, and pear.

CREAMY SOUTHERN SPICED CHICKEN

This creamy spiced chicken meal is a truly delightful dish. Succulently tender southern spiced chicken breasts simmered in a creamy, garlic-y tomato sauce are what winter dinner dreams are made of.

This is a marvellously versatile recipe because it can be served with many different sides such as mash and vegetables, steamed rice or even your favourite pasta for a quick and easy way to vary your weeknight whip ups that can be ready and on the table in 20 minutes flat. I've used my Creole seasoning to bring the authentic flavours of the Deep South of Louisiana to the table, with a subtle pop of chilli to warm up the palette while we still have cooler evenings. The cream will tone down the heat a little, so for those of you who do like it with a little extra hum on the palette simply garnish with a sprinkle of Creole seasoning on top.

Did you know? At present there are approximately 20 billion chickens scratching around the world, but the first domesticated chicken was not actually for eating but for fighting. Humans raised these special fowl for cockfights, starting in Southeast Asia and China as early as 10,000 BC and yet their prized meat wasn't enjoyed by all until much later. By 2500 BC, the chicken had traveled to all civilised areas of Asia, the Middle East and Africa by migrating populations and early seafaring trade. The spread of The Roman Empire brought the chicken to Europe as an affordable food option. Many Roman documents written by Pliny, Cato, and the oldest surviving cookbook 'Apicius de re Coquinaria' describe the chicken's importance as a nourishing and delicious food

Chef Dylan tip: There are a few things other than my Creole seasoning that make this dish so super delicious:

- 1. Tomato paste! If you're not in the habit of keeping this superstar ingredient in your pantry, it's time to pick up a new habit. Tomato paste is essentially tomato concentrate tomatoes that are cooked down for hours until nearly all of the moisture has been cooked out, and all that's left is a densely flavourful distillation of tomato flavour. It's a source of umami, and really intensifies the tomato flavour of this dish.
- Cheese! If you're feeling opulent, go for the real-deal, grate-yourself a hunk of Parmigiano-Reggiano. Just like the tomato paste, Parmigiano-Reggiano is a source of natural umami heaven.

"That'll be six pound please sir" says the cabbie with his thick singsong Bristolian accent. "I've 'eard nuthin' but good things about that there place yer off to" he chirps while his bushy moustache dances across his lip like a huge hairy caterpillar.

"Yes, it's just received its first Michelin star and I'm thrilled to see what the chef has in store for us" I say excitedly. We walk under the white stone arches with 'Casamia' blazed across the top with regal silver cast letters. I open the huge glass doors and enter the restaurant. We are promptly greeted by the Maitre d' who seems very serious and has a look as if we may be lost.

"Your name on the reservation, sir"? "Gittoes" I reply "ahh yes okaaay, two people for the 7 o'clock seating" he murmurs as if talking to himself. "Diane will see you to your table" he announces. Appearing suddenly like some apparition, a tall, blond Viking gracefully appears right on cue. "Follow me please" she offers. Snaking through the dimly lit room, I see it's full of diners; turning to my love I whisper in her ear "we are the youngest people here". As we are seated, Diane in her educated clipped English elegantly begins her monologue "Welcome to Casamia, where art meets science. Soon your 19-course meal will commence, our menu changes daily and no, sadly we do not cater for dietary requirements. I see you have opted for the matching wines, excellent choice. Can I get you still or sparkling water to begin?". "Still, please" we both say in unison.

I look down at the menu and 'quail lollipop' pops out at me, and then spy another item from the tasting menu 'crispy chicken, cream and tomato' before in a flash, it is suddenly whipped away. "Uh-uh no cheating says my date with a twinkle in her eye, it's much better as a surprise don't you think?". "Yes, you're right" I reply as I pull out a deck of well-loved playing cards. "Loser pays for dinner" I suggest with a mischievous smile. "Might as well pull out your money right now then" she retorts with playful confidence "We'll see about that!" I quip as I fling her the first card.

This easy dinner is well worth trying if you like a bit of spice. Who knows? it could become a regular favourite on your menu.



Serves 4 – Prep 5 mins – Cook 20 mins Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 kg chicken breast (4 medium), boneless, skinless
- 3 tbs Creole*
- 2 tbsp tomato paste
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1x 400g can crushed tomatoes
- 300 ml thickened cream
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese, divided
- 1/4 cup fresh basil leaves, thinly sliced

*Chef Dylan's Gourmet Food Co. Creole marinade

Method

- 1. In a small bowl place 2 tbs creole and 1 tbs oil and combine.
- Coat the chicken breast with marinade and set aside.
- 3. In a large fry pan or skillet set over medium-high heat add the olive oil.
- Add chicken to skillet and cook until golden on the bottom, about 5 minutes. Turn and cook until golden on the other side, about 5 minutes longer. Remove chicken from the pan check it is just cooked and set aside.
- 5. In the same skillet add garlic and cook until just fragrant ~1 minute.
- 6. Add 1 tbs creole and stir then add tomato paste and cook stirring for 1 min.
- 7. Add crushed tomatoes and bring to a simmer, allow to cook for 3 minutes.
- 8. Stir in the heavy cream and ¼ cup parmesan cheese.
- 9. Place chicken back into the skillet.
- 10. Allow to gently simmer on low to cook for 5 more minutes to thicken the sauce.
- 11. Serve topped with fresh basil and remaining cheese.




