Councillor's Comment

DEREK SWANBOROUGHDIVISION 1



A VERY SAD DAY FOR TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN

Council caves in again and won't oppose 11 large two- storey disability cabins in a residential area at 1-11 Eagles Retreat Place.

Council at its last Ordinary meeting gave Council Officers the power to instruct its solicitors to either continue to oppose the developer application for 11 cabins or to agree to an approval with conditions. It was a fait accompli, as I was certain that Council fully intended to walk away from this Court case. As it turned out, that's exactly what happened. I voted against the motion, but it was lost 6 votes to one.

A few days later, Councillors were advised that our solicitors had advised the Court it would not pursue the matter further.

This was the case where the developer applied to build a house, got it approved, then proceeded to apply to Council for approval for a tennis court and gazebo for the dwelling as a "Minor Change", got it approved, and with haste, the developer sent in the bulldozers to clear the vegetation. Residents reported frightened koalas squealing from the falling old-growth trees. They had no wildlife spotters present. Just a day or two after this, a new development application was received by Council for 12 disability cabins, and you guessed it, cabins were shown in the very area where the tennis court and gazebo was approved, and the vegetation cleared.

Even a Gold Coast Developer told me: "Derek, they would never have gotten away with this if we were in the Gold Coast City Council".

Well, I reported this matter to you on 2nd July 2020 in the *Scenic News* newspaper and *Tamborine Times*, and told you how the developer had gamed the process, and that it was likely their original intention to apply for a cabin development and clear enormous amounts of vegetation from this steep escarpment site.

COMPLAINT MADE TO THE OIA

You can guess the next step. I received in the mail a letter from the Office of Independent Assessor (OIA) in September 2020, saying a complaint had been received that I misled the public because I said an application and clearing had occurred for a unit development (at that point, we knew the Developer's real intentions) but the complainant argued no, it was for a Tennis Court.

The complaint therefore was as follows:

- My Conduct in saying it was for a Unit development and not a Tennis
 Court and Gazebo was a breach of the trust placed in me as a
 Councillor, either knowingly or recklessly, and that his conduct was not
 consistent with Local Government Principle in section 4 (2) (e) "Ethical
 and Legal behaviour of Councillors ...
- Council went on to list the sequence of approvals to try and justify its approvals

The OIA advised me that this was likely misconduct and I had to respond, which I did.

I denied the allegations and provided reasons.

The OIA didn't accept them, and summoned me to their Office for a certain day and time saying I MUST ATTEND or be subject to a HEFTY FINE OF AROUND \$10,000.

I ATTENDED ON 19TH July 2021 and was grilled for an hour. We both recorded the Interview.

Some months later, I received a notification from The OIA that they would refer me to the Conduct Tribunal, and that I had the opportunity to provide a further statement in the interests of natural justice.

I provided that statement, and it was also linked to four other complaints to the Tribunal from the Council CEO or Executive about my Councillor Comments column over the last two years. It took me almost a full week to research and prepare my defence.

On 29th June 2022 (nearly 2 years later), I received notification from the OIA that they were dismissing the complaint as it was an unjustifiable use of resources to continue, and Council's case had not met the legal thresholds of a "breach of trust".

THINKING OF BECOMING A COUNCILLOR?

Well, you may have an easier time if there are reforms to the OIA before 2024. Let's hope a new CEO at Scenic Rim Council takes charge and reverses a toxic culture that that has used the OIA for political purposes. It doesn't happen in other Councils like this when common sense prevails. One thing that won't change will be the need for any new Tamborine Councillor to boldly stand up for the Mountain's interests if we don't succeed in going to the GCCC. Time to start thinking about March 2024.


WHAT HAPPENS NEXT WITH THE EAGLES RETREAT PLACE COURT CASE?

This matter has now gone on for 13 months and only Jeanette Lockey and Amanda Hay from the Progress Association will attend court, give evidence, cross-examine witnesses and present the Mountain's case to protect it from this inappropriate development in a Residential Area. They will argue against the developer, based on issues of amenity and compliance with the Council's Strategic Framework in its planning scheme. It's a David and Goliath fight, and we must take our hats off to them, as they have now devoted 12 months of their own time and costs in the Court process, when our Council has abandoned the fight believing they cannot win. As Judge Williamson said to the respondents in a hearing recently, you only have to prove one point and the case could be won. Let's hope they are successful and common sense prevails.

Council workers subjected to abusive behaviour from community members

In recent weeks, Scenic Rim Regional Council has recorded multiple instances of serious abuse directed towards Council employees and contractors.

Council has zero-tolerance for abuse of any kind towards any employee or contractor of Council.

We are collectively proud of our wonderful Scenic Rim community: a community of hardworking people who are supportive and respectful. It is unfortunate that a very small minority of our residents believe that it is acceptable to treat others with disrespect.

Abuse or threatening behaviour towards Council staff, both within the workplace or within the community, is not acceptable. Any situation where abuse is directed at, or impacts, a Council employee or contractor while undertaking their duties, is taken very seriously. This includes abuse in the following circumstances:

- Face-to-face interactions (across all of Council's services, delivered out in the community or in Council's facilities)
- Telephone interactions
- Written correspondences such as letters, emails and online submissions
- Council's social media platforms, including comments on posts and direct messages

Matters may be referred to the Queensland Police Service (QPS), if necessary.

We all have our jobs to do. Let's work together with respect to maintain the values of our spectacular region.

THE LISTER ENGINE (CHUFF, CHUFF)

Sir Robert Ashton Lister founded Lister Co. producing machines powered by a drive belt to external sources like steam, horse or water power. In the early 1890s he began to produce portable petrol-powered machinery for farm use. The slow-running engines soon gained a reputation for reliability and longevity.

On Heritage open days and other special events, sparks from the foundry as the metal is tortured and twisted, and by watching butter being made, add color to the static displays. Sometimes a gentle background noise might be appropriate. The tractors could not be left running for the duration of an Open Day. What was needed was a small reliable engine that would add some acoustics to the day.

The society advertised for a petrol motor as a donation. No response!

Years later, out of the blue, Ken Leiber from Byron Bay offered as a donation a 1943 Lister Model 104L in 'sort of' running order. Perfect!

Under the watchful eye of volunteer Tony Shorter, taking it up to exhibition standard while ensuring it still ran, was carried out.

Visitors can look forward to the rhythmic, slow tick over, more like a 'chuff, chuff, chuff' sound of this motor. In a world of awash with complex electronic gadgetry, there is something highly reassuring about the simple machines of our past.

Visit the Heritage Center at Wongawallan Rd any Sunday from 11:00 AM until 3:00 PM and see the Lister and many other interesting exhibits.

IT'S A LOTTERY... TIME TO STAND UP

After my elderly neighbour died, some developers bought his quaint 1950s cottage at 735 Main Western Road, Mt Tamborine under the pretence of making it their family home.

However, they promptly demolished 95% of it and constructed a huge ugly monstrosity, without council approval.

The ground floor comprises a large reception room complete with a prominent bar area which can be seen from the street.

They later tried to get permission from the SRRC to create this huge commercial operation, which included a massive spa bath house (the onsens), an enormous car park and numerous cabins, all to be built on a known land slip area in a residential zone. Come and see it.

The SRRC rightly denied their hideous proposal, stating that it would not comply with the SRRC Planning Scheme and would contradict community expectations of privacy and natural environment. In other words, this outrageous proposal had no merit. When the developer appealed against the SRRC ruling, a vote of councillors was required.

The SRRC inexplicably reversed its original decision and voted 4/2 to allow this invasive and horrible development to proceed unchanged.

The SRRC broke their own rules to favour a greedy developer over residential ratepayers and citizens of Tamborine Mountain. Why?

We should be "up in arms" over this dereliction of council duty and responsibility. My quiet, peaceful rural environment will now be forever ruined by a callous developer. My neighbouring property will fall in value and I will face constant crowds, lights, and the noise of industry, potentially from 9.00am to 8.00pm.

Do not think this is an isolated situation and won't happen to you, in your "safe" area. None of us is safe from this belligerent council. I am now compelled to attend court on 7th September to defend my rights against the developer and possibly pay legal costs for having my living dreams shattered.

Please help me by supporting the Tamborine Mountain Progress Association (TMPA) in fighting against this ridiculous development. Oppose this development by writing to council, state government and media outlets. Help fund TMPA in this legal battle over this and other in appropriate developments.

The SRRC has abandoned Tamborine Mountain ratepayers, where we pay more and get less than ratepayers in Boonah and Beaudesert.

Please help me oppose this lifechanging proposal supported by an inept council where the weak are isolated and picked off in preference to rich developers.

Remember, united we win, isolated we fall.

If this can happen to me in my quiet residential zone, it can also happen to you.

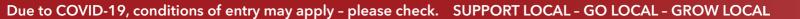



A YOGA SPRING PRACTICE

Spring is always announced with great fanfare on my property in Boyland. I have a pair of peregrine falcons who arrive at the start of Spring to reclaim their straggly nest, much to the dismay and anger of the

local birds and the local chooks. Gorgeous, aloof, disinterested in anything but their own cyclical drive to nest and reproduce, I am always delighted to hear of their arrival. And to add to the excitement of the season, a young koala at the Daisy Hill Mountain Biking circuit, climbed down one of the trees and gravely observed the humans who were speeding past. Very special.

When you spend a lot of time outdoors observing things like weather patterns, wind direction, plant growth and seasonal birdsong, you start to tune into the cycles of life. And when you collate these many little pieces into a bigger picture over a season, a year and a decade, you can learn so much about how the natural world around us copes with change. As living, breathing creatures of nature, we are no less connected to the seasons than the flowering gums and the migrating birds. It just takes slowing and listening to notice the subtleties and tuning into the changing energy around us.

In the world of yoga and Ayurveda, Spring is the season of detoxing, lightening the load, decluttering and cleaning up from the legacy of Winter. We don't just focus on our external environment and our bodies; we also consider our internal worlds. Paying attention to any heavy emotions in the heart and deciding on how to learn from them or release them.

Our yoga practice tunes into this rising energy of change around us and we consider the balance of Yin (feminine, Ida energy) and Yang (masculine, Pingala energy) in our bodies. In this instance the Yang is keeping you strong, that bamboo strength in the body. And the Yin is giving you that suppleness and pliability of the bamboo nature, internally. As you observe these two different qualities you realise that strength and flexibility are really the same thing. If you are imbalanced in the Yang: strong, rigid, stiff and resistant to change, metaphorically, you'll snap when life gets challenging and as those Springtime winds blow. If you are imbalanced in the Yin: flexible but with no core strength and perhaps internally, indecisive, susceptible to others' opinions with no strong convictions of your own, you'll fold into anxiety and stress under the challenges of life and in the season of change. So, our yoga practice physically focusses on the harmony and the balance between staying strong and yet supple and emotionally finding our internal moral codes without becoming rigid, judgemental and small minded.

Spring then becomes our seasonal opportunity to detox, organise, balance and transform.

THE IMPORTANCE OF DADS

Steve Biddulph, author of many books on parenting and relationships, tells a poignant story that occurred as he sat by his dying dad's bedside. His dad related an incident that happened when Steve was only a few days old. He placed Steve in a pram and proudly walked him down the main street of the small town in which they lived. He noticed that passersby were staring at him and frowning. Then some children followed behind him began making fun of him, calling out "Your dad's your mum!" At this point Steve's shy dad abandoned the walk and took a short cut home. His dad began to cry, and Steve realised that he was conveying to him that he had tried to be a hands-on dad. However, in the 1950's this was not seen as a man's role and was actively discouraged.

Thankfully, the role of fathers has evolved since the 1950s and parenting is now a shared responsibility. Despite this, in a recent survey of more than 1,000 families, two-thirds of dads desired to be more involved in the early years of parenting. They felt relieved when they had opportunity to help in a 'hands-on' way. The desire of dads to be more involved in caregiving is explained by recent interesting studies. Evidently, when a new baby arrives, the father's hormones change. Dads become more placid and less competitive. They switch into caring mode, and feel happier being close to their children.

Mums can sometimes experience ambiguity in sharing parenting, particularly when their partner approaches parenting differently. The most successful co-parenting couples tend to be the ones where mum allows dad to specialise and have a unique connection with their kids rather than duplicating the same experiences. At times children will need security and will seek their primary caregiver. Other times they are seeking adventure or play and will look to the other parent. Newcastle University researched rough and tumble play with dads and kids. They found that through this activity kids learn what it means to be safe and moderate their emotions through the combined experience of excitement and safety. Once parents understand and accept that the best thing for their child is a balance of delineated but not defined roles, they tend to do well.

Other research on the role of fathers suggests that the influence of father love on children's development is as great as the influence of mother love. Dads help children develop a sense of their place in the world, which helps their social, emotional and cognitive development and functioning. It can be as simple as attending your child's sports, walking the dog together or sitting down and catching up with what has happened in your child's day. These activities convey to your children that they are important, interesting and worthwhile.

To all our dads, have an awesome Father's Day celebrating who you are and the unique and valuable contribution you make to your children's lives.

As we age, our ability to drive may deteriorate due to a number of reasons. We may suffer from anxiety due to busy road conditions or have a medical issue that prevents us from driving on a temporary basis e.g., following surgery, or on a permanent basis due to vision problems, dementia, or sleep disorder,s to name

Tamborine Mountain Community Care can assist with transport needs, the cost of which is subsidised through the Commonwealth Home Support Program.

Transport options include bus transport, both locally and to the Gold Coast, for shopping trips or individual transport in a car to enable access to medical appointments, both locally and to more distant destinations, including the Gold Coast and Brisbane.

Bus transport operates every Tuesday to Gold Coast Shopping Centres on a three-weekly rotation to Helensvale, Burleigh and Runaway Bay. Pick up is from your front door, and you will have approximately 3 hours shopping time at your destination before the return trip.

A shuttle bus service is offered every Thursday. Pick up is from your home and the destination is the North Tamborine business centre so that clients can access the Post Office, Library, Council Offices etc. The service also visits the chemist, and the IGA shopping complex. The attending clients also have lunch at a local café which they may not be able to access at any other time, this provides local businesses with much needed custom and

other community members.

Transport to attend medical appointments is available Monday – Friday, fees are variable depending on destination. We rely on the generosity of volunteers for their time and use of their own vehicles to deliver this service.

Additionally, once a month we run a bus service to Oxenford so that clients can spend time at Bunnings, Kmart and Aldi for a different shopping experience to that which is offered at the shopping malls visited on Tuesdays.

Water chestnuts are a must for this dish, with their incredibly unique texture; they can easily be found tinned in the Asian section of the supermarket.

Did you know? Water chestnuts are super popular in Asian cuisine, but they are not, as their name implies, literally nuts, nor are they legumes: they are actually aquatic tubers, similar to potatoes. They can qualify as a superfood because they are high in potassium, manganese, copper, fibre, riboflavin, vitamin B6, and copper. They also contain a good dose of vitamin C, calcium, iron, and phosphorus. They even have lots of antioxidants, particularly ferulic acid, which has the wonderful effect of keeping foods crisp and crunchy even after being heated.

Chef Dylan tip: When you are frying off the pork make sure the fry pan is nice and hot, with enough oil to ensure the mince sizzles. I like to use a cast iron skillet or even better, a wok, as these tend to retain the heat better. When adding the pork to the pan, do so in small chunks, and let it brown up nicely before stirring.

"You boys hungry? Fancy an early dinner?", asks my best friend's father from the driver's seat of his 4x4 Pajero, as we head to his home in the Northern suburbs for the weekend. "Does a one-legged duck swim in a circle?" replies Chris, smiling from the front seat. "Always the comedian, ya smart Alec", he says while shaking his head from side to side. "What about you Dylan?". "Sure, Mr Darling, I could definitely eat." "Dave is fine mate. You like Chinese? Because I know an excellent restaurant only 10 minutes away." "China Chilli in the mall?" Chris pipes up. "Yes, Chris, you got it, we've been going there for years." "Can we get the banquet pleeeease?" pleads Chris. "Alright, alright, let's have a feast then; you two are growing young men after all." "Thanks Dad! This is going to be epic! I'm starving" says Chris,

excitedly rubbing his hands together.

We park up, and Dave holds the large wooden door open and gestures for us to enter the dimly lit restaurant. The place is empty at 4pm, except for an elderly Chinese man slurping on a steaming bowl of noodles, sat alone in

the far corner. "That's the owner's father, he's always here, and look, here comes his mother. 'Hello Mrs. Chan'" says Dave respectfully, as a small Chinese woman shuffles to greet us with a smile missing a few teeth. "Mr Darling, how r-ovely to see you again so soon. Pr-ease take a seat". I pull out the heavy metal chair padded with bright red plush fabric and take a seat.

"Can we please order a banquet for 3 people Mrs. Chan" says Dave politely. "Any drinks?" Says Mrs Chan. "I'll have the usual. A small bottle of Tsingtao. And you boys want a couple of Cokes?" "Yeah Ok. Great" we both say, nodding. "No pl-oblem" says Mrs. Chan "I'll let Nick know you are here. I'm sure he will want to come say hi" as she retreats to the kitchen. A few moments later, a burly man in a pristine chef uniform appears. "Mr Darling, Sir so lovely to see you" he says in a perfect Aussie accent whilst enthusiastically shaking his hand. "And you have brought your son, and is this a friend from school today?". "Sure is. Dylan wants to be chef someday" adds Dave. "Good choice man! Welcome to China, Chilli Dylan" says Nick warmly, with both his thumbs up. "I hope you are hungry because you are about to see why Dave keeps coming back all these years" he says laughing, while patting his apron wrapped around his large well-rounded belly. "First course today is San Chov Bow. I can't wait to hear what you think Dylan, this is my Dad's family recipe. And after the meal, I can give you a tour of the kitchen if you like."

Memories spent together with good food in good company are some of my happiest, and I was fortunate for my mate Chris to invite me along to share time with his Dad, and for the Chan family's warm welcome, delicious banquet and hospitality.

Prep 15 mins. Cook 5 mins. Serves 2.

Sauce

- 1 1/4 tsp corn flour
- 3 tbs water
- 60 mls Luck Dragon Sauce*



*Chef Dylan's Gourmet Food Co. Luck Dragon Asian sauce

Filling

- 3 tbs peanut oil
- 1 clove large garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp ginger, minced
- 300g pork mince
- 1/2 brown onion, finely chopped
- 1 small carrot, finely chopped
- 100g canned water chestnuts, drained and sliced

Assembly

- 1 x fancy lettuce,
- 50g Crushed peanuts
- Finely sliced shallots

Method

- In a small bowl mix the corn flour with water. Then add my Luck Dragon Asian sauce and mix.
- Heat 1 tbs oil in a wok or large skillet over high heat.
- 3. Add garlic and ginger, give it a quick mix then whack in the carrot and onion.
- 4. Cook for 2 minutes stirring, then remove from pan into a bowl.
- 5. Wipe out skillet and heat on high.
- Add remaining oil and fry the pork until cooked then return the cooked veg to the pan and combine.
- Add sauce and stir through then cook for ~11/2 minutes or until sauce thickens and is lovely and glossy, coating all the mixture.
- Transfer filling into serving bowl. Lay out lettuce leaves, peanuts and scallions on the side.
- 9. Eat by placing some Filling inside the lettuce leaf. Sprinkle the shallots and peanuts on the top, then wrap it up and munch it!

LIONS' PROGRAM TO SAVE SIGHT

Every month, Lions Club member Gloria McKenzie collects several dozen pairs of discarded spectacles from various sites around the Mountain. The Leos Club (junior Lions) at the Tamborine Mountain College currently do likewise. Part of an Australia-wide Lions program, the glasses go to a warehouse in Brisbane, where they are checked by experts, appropriately labelled, and distributed to developing countries. Not only is it an important health initiative, it's global recycling in action.

One billion people worldwide currently live with a vision impairment. 'Vision' forms one of the Lions Club's International five key 'global causes' (the others are diabetes, hunger, environment and childhood cancer). It was Helen Keller, the author and disability rights advocate, who in 1925 urged US Lions Clubs to join her in a 'crusade against darkness', planting a seed that has yielded a rich harvest worldwide, including Tamborine Mountain.

Both nationally and internationally, Lions awards grants for vision-related programs and research. At the local level, the



Lions Club of Tamborine Mountain, via its Saturday raffles and Steak Wagon, and parking at the country markets, donates to the national Lions Eye Health Program, which educates the community about avoidable vision loss.

Sometimes there's a local in need. Recently, the TM Club banded with other clubs to buy a Braille tablet computer for a man in his twenties with vision impairment. A software test analyst, he uses his new computer for technical purposes, plus the usual administrative issues like checking emails, notetaking, using Dropbox etc. In his leisure time, he can access Facebook, music apps and much more.

The local can connect with the global. The TM Lions Club in 2019 supported local optometrist Nicky Carr, practice owner of Tamborine Mountain Optometrists, to join the 10-day Trek for Sight fundraising challenge in Sri Lanka. (The practice supports a Vision Centre in that country.) The Club has also supported Nicky's team to run free glaucoma testing. With the rise of diabetes and age-related vision impairment, local health promotion is vital.

So, take your old glasses to the Eagle Heights Pharmacy, or TM Optometrists, and you'll be doing someone a big favour! This is a practical, 'service in action' initiative that is the lifeblood of Lions. And – by the way – have an eye test!





INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT BOOKISH THINGS


BOOKS ACTUALLY DO HAVE A "SMELL" WHICH BECOMES MORE POTENT **AS THEY AGE**
