RATES LIKELY TO HIKE - BUT BY HOW MUCH?

The Scenic Rim Regional Council has released a draft budget proposing a 7.9% increase in rates and community infrastructure charges. Waste charges are also anticipated to rise by 11%.

This draft budget seeks public feedback on the Council's suggested projects and expenses for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

This is a new approach for the Council, as the draft highlights major capital works items (such as roads, bridges, drainage, and footpaths) and expected increases in daily operations (including wages, materials, and finance costs).

The document also presents a scenario of a deficit budget with a 6.9% rate increase, which is below the current CPI and would require dipping into cash reserves. Moreover, it models the results of an 8.9% rate increase, leading to a surplus budget and a growth in cash holdings.

At present, the CPI (Cost Price Index), an indicator of inflation, stands at approximately 7.8%.

The document does not provide an estimate for carryover funds from uncompleted capital works or unspent money allocated for operational expenses in the 2022-2023 budget.



Councillor's Comment

AMANDA HAY DIVISION 1



These are my own personal views. I do not purport to speak on behalf of Council. Decisions of Council are made only by majority vote, legislative authority or under authority delegated by Council.

Development Applications: MCU22/088 MCU Short-Term Accommodation & Function Facility at 84 Eagle Heights Rd. This application was on the Agenda for Council's Ordinary meeting of 9 May with a recommendation for approval. Unfortunately I was unable to vote as I have a Prescribed Conflict of Interest as I made a submission when this Development Application was publicly advertised. At the time of writing, the vote was yet to occur.

Out and About: I attended ANZAC Day ceremonies at St Bernards State School and Tamborine Mountain College and it was rewarding to meet committed teaching staff and such self-confident students of all ages. I also attended the Dawn Service and the 11.00am service (as usual).

I have had discussions with residents in relation to Land Valuation Objections (although this is not a Council matter), attended the Long Sunset event at Elysian Fields, fielded and directed enquiries re:- potentially non-compliant land uses and attended the official Commencement of Construction Ceremony for the now-named Teviot Park international standard equestrian centre project which was funded by the Federal Government, and delivered on time and on budget by the Boonah Show Society Inc. My riding boots came in handy although they have not been near a horse for a while!

On Saturday 6 May we were honoured to have our SRRC official Town Crier, Syd Norman, make two official cries on Gallery Walk to commemorate the coronation of King Charles III. Visitors to Gallery Walk were keen for a photo opportunity, and Syd certainly knows how to draw a crowd!

Community consultation: The Draft Budget and Capital Works Program community consultation session held on Thursday 27 April was well attended by approximately 40 people, indicating once again our community's strong interest and participation in matters affecting our future. TRAVELLING PLACES with Elizabeth Dowler

JAPAN - POPULATED BY UNIQUE PEOPLE

Our Globus guide, Hiro, was full of admiration for us having travelled independently from our point of entry into the country – Osaka – and reached Tokyo to join the tour.

From the time we touched down in Osaka to being released from the terminal, three long hours passed. Never before have I encountered such a tedious and inefficient entry process for foreigners. Perhaps 'Spring Break' holiday had something to do with it, and they are still concerned with COVID.

Was it worth going to Osaka first? Oh yes, our timing was perfect for the blooming cherry blossom in the streets and around Himeji and Osaka Castles - sensational. Our stay here also allowed us to acclimatise to the abundance of humanity in Japan... everywhere, and this is not counting foreign visitors (tourism is now back to 100%). In fact, Japan has a problem as it does not have enough English-speaking guides and it is begging retired tour guides to come back to work. Hiro was close to 65 and 'Daisy' was close to 70!

A day trip from Tokyo seemed doomed, with its showers and heavy cloud. (The weather is very changeable in Japan). Just as we arrived at the viewpoint, the clouds dispersed, the sun came out and 398 steps later, I had an awesome view of Mt Fuji framed by a towering pagoda and cherry trees.

Ex-Tokyo, our route took us up into the mountains to Takayama, an alpine town famous for its old wooden houses and where, amongst other things, we visited a Sake brewery. It snowed overnight. Further on, Shirakawa did not disappoint with its famous A-framed thatched dwellings nestled in a valley.

After Kanazawa, we reached Japan's old capital Kyoto by train, where Buddhism and Shintoism reside side by side. Apart from the mandatory visits to temples, shrines and vintage shopping arcades, we walked through the Gion district. I went back alone at night, and in true paparazzi-style, managed quite a few decent photos of the Geishas scurrying around in the lantern-lit lanes.

Our tour has also included two of the top three gardens in Japan.

From Kyoto, we shot down to Hiroshima on the 'bullet' and here visited the Atomic Bomb Dome, the flame of Peace and the Cenotaph, and spent time in the Memorial Museum. It was all very graphic.

My visit here has



opened my eyes, and I have learnt a lot about Japanese culture. The cities are squeaky-clean, skyscrapers freshly hosed with manicured gardens at their feet. Bins for garbage are few and far between so, presumably, everyone is trained to take their waste home with them to dispose of. And transportation is super-efficient. In fact, it is so essential to the rail authorities that their timetable is adhered to precisely that instructions are relayed to passengers to be completely prepared to disembark well before the train comes to a standstill – no dilly-dallying!

The courteous, rather shy people are exceedingly fussy, and pride themselves on their perfection, their traditions and protocols. I have now witnessed many of these in regard to food, dining, train travel, use of a spa, the exchange of money and social interaction. And I have been required to remove my shoes on endless occasions. I have started bowing. Even the bus driver acknowledges his passengers by bowing and the conductor on the train, when passing through a carriage, turns around at the end and bows to all of us before moving on.

Even our guide, Hiro, made fun of his folk. He likened them to cucumbers standing upright on a shelf. You can't tell the difference; they are clone-like. This is especially true of businessmen in suits and school students in uniforms. He also commented that many of them, while carrying out prescribed tasks very ably, have a great deal of difficulty coping if a change is required.

And so, I have a question. How is it these people are so innovative and forward-thinking when they are bound by so many self-imposed rules, restrictions and protocols? I am curious.

COST OF LIVING

The chaos and crises of the Palaszczuk Government are driving up the cost of living for all Queenslanders.

The LNP is holding the Government to account and focusing on the needs of Queensland families. We have already secured important cost-of-living wins for Queensland families by forcing the Palaszczuk Government to stop Labor's renters' tax, stop Labor's patients' tax (well, they deferred it to 2025, so if they are re-elected next year going to see your GP will be more expensive again), and reduce the cost of a learner's licence by \$100 to help young Queenslanders.

It's an amount of money equivalent to rent for an average Queensland family for 21 years. Queenslanders deserve a government that treats their money with respect. Queensland deserves better.

COUNCIL BUDGET CONSULTATION

I congratulate Council on its move to have budget consultations. Three community sessions were held: Boonah, Beaudesert and Tamborine Mountain. Attendance was 3, 14 and 40 respectively. In addition, the community was invited to submit thoughts through the *Have Your Say* application on Council's website.

Council also invited submitters to attend the Council meeting on Tue 9 May when they were given an opportunity to have their final say. I attended that Council meeting and my submission is below:

"Council is to be congratulated on setting up the community budget consultation sessions and allowing a final presentation at this Council meeting. Let us hope that it leads to changes in your draft budget.

I have four issues.

Issue 1.

Your proposed rate rise of 7.9% is too high in the current climate. Families and single people are finding it tough. Even your employees are finding it tough. However, employees can and have, asked for a wage rise. Some community members cannot do this and have to find cuts to their expenditure budget.

This is what Council needs to do for this budget in order to bring the rate rise down to a reasonable level.

Issue 2

Most of the rates go into the operational budget but, you are refusing to publish the budget in full. At the Tamborine Mountain session, you said that this act would publish the employee costs. If this is a concern, then delete those costs but publish the rest of the operational budget. This will allow the community to see how Council is spending the \$1.7m on Regional Prosperity, \$1.6m on Community Development, \$1.5m on Cultural Services, \$1.4m on Customer Contact etc.

Issue 3

Council is proposing to spend \$500,000 on a footpath along Wongawallan Rd. In 2013, as Councillor for Division 1,





THE ETHIOPIAN WOLF – RAREST CARNIVORE ON THE PLANET

The only wolf living in Africa and enlisted as endangered. He is also called the Simian jackal or Simian fox, because they are smaller and lighter in structure than wolves and only weigh between 12-20 kgs. They are similar to a coyote or even dingo in size and build, and having a long narrow muzzle. The fur is a tawny red and white with a black bushy tail. Native to the ever-decreasing Ethiopian highlands, which has seven isolated mountain ranges with altitudes of 3,000 – 4,500 metres.

Unlike other Canids which may be widespread and general feeders, this wolf is a highly specialised feeder of Afroalpine rodents, which include grass rats, giant mole rats, hares, young ungulates (hoofed animals) goslings, eggs, and they sometimes feed or scavenge on carcasses. The Ethiopian wolves perform a very specific habitat requirement by being key predators in the ecosystems they inhabit; controlling the population of prey animals. They can reach speeds of up to 48km per hour. Yet, their existence is threatened by farmers encroaching on their land and killing them, as well as habitat destruction and degradation. Another threat that has had a tragic effect, wiping out whole packs, is disease from domestic dog populations that are not vaccinated.

The wolves do not populate like other types; they are monogamous, mating exclusively and only with the dominant female. Other females are reproductively supressed. Litter sizes vary from 2-6 pups and just once a year. It isn't until they reach two years of age that they are ready to breed. All adults help to look after and feed the pups by regurgitation of food

they have eaten. The dispersal of lone wolves from a pack to form a new pack is restricted by the scarcity of unoccupied habitat.

The Ethiopian wolf has a different and fascinating social life; primarily, they hunt alone, yet they are social and form packs of usually six members but sometimes between three to thirteen members. Various packs are territorial and they gather for greetings and border patrols at dawn, midday and evening. Maintaining their territory through scent and vocalisation. Pack structure is hierarchical and clearly defined by dominant and submissive behaviour, both sexes have a dominance ranking. Their vocalisation and greeting calls use a combination of throat growls and whines of submission, the whining is at a high frequency, and it sounds similar to a cat.

NATURE AND SOMATIC HEALING

Autumn weather is perfect for gardening. Not yet too dry to dig that hole, with crisp mornings and warm

days. And to make my recent gardening forays even more fun, are four brown chooks, gifted to me by a girlfriend leaving the area. These nosey, affectionate, greedy, sentient beings shadow my every movement and scratch with great delight into every new pile of soil. Gardening, being in nature and hanging out with these small brown hens, is healing to us on every level and could be likened to Somatic healing.

I teach a fair amount of Somatic and Trauma informed Yoga, mainly to private clients. And somatics by its very definition is body orientated, which is what yoga is all about. Paying attention to how the body feels and why we hold particular tension, trauma or pain in one part of the body. We try to get out of the head and tune into the wisdom of the body and then connect the mind/ body relationship with new awareness and insight, which can be very healing. Somatic yoga is ultimately about trusting this natural intelligence that is the core of our being. The same intelligence that grows trees and moves clouds across the sky, this intelligence in all of us, supports our healing process. Somatic yoga allows us to reconnect with our emotions, our discomfort and our pain and move away from the freeze, flight or fight cycle we have been trapped in.

How do we get so dissociated from our very own bodies and feelings? A lot comes from childhood. When we receive the proper support in childhood, our nervous systems will return to a state of homeostasis after a stressful event as naturally as a plant leans towards sunlight. If we don't get that proper support as children, we often resist that process, shutting it down and often seeking some other way to feel better. And, hence, round and round we go with our trauma patterns for most of our lives – patterns of behaviour, thought patterns, emotional cycles all intimately connected, playing out on repeat.

So where does gardening and hanging out with the chooks fit into somatic healing? Nature is an important part of any somatic healing journey. When we go into natural spaces, we're drawn into our senses, observing and experiencing the smell of the soil and the song of the birds. Wide open spaces somehow gift us more inner space to notice and be curious about our feelings and our bodies. A shout out to all the mums on this special week where we honour our mums.

I write this article on what would have been my mother's 90th birthday. Even many years after her departure, her legacy lives on. I catch a glimpse of myself in the mirror and I see her expression. I make a comment and I suddenly realise it was something Mum used to say. My husband would be the first to agree I have her stubborn and determined nature! But alongside that she had a huge capacity for compassion. I didn't really acknowledge our similarities while she was with us, but I now realise the huge deposit she has left behind in the lives of those she spent time with. She wasn't exactly my loudest cheerleader, but I know she was quietly proud of my achievements.

Never underestimate the influence of a mother. From the day a child is born, it is the mother's voice more than all others that activates areas of the baby's brain, creating neural pathways necessary for development. In 2012 a large study was conducted on school-aged children. It discovered that those children who had been positively supported by their mothers had a larger hippocampus than those who had not received the same level of support. The hippocampus is an area of the brain that plays a major role in memory and learning. Mums, your presence and support in your child's life actually improves their ability to learn.

There are many great achieving men and women in history who have attributed their success to the support shown by their mother. Thomas Edison was the seventh and last child of his mother Nancy. He attended school for a few short months and struggled (it is now believed Edison had ADHD). One day he overhead the teacher describe him as "addled", mentally deficient, and it was not worthwhile keeping him in school. Thomas returned home crying. As an adult Thomas recounted that day: "My mother came out as my strong defender. She brought me back to the school and angrily told the teacher that he didn't know what he was talking about, that I had more brains than he himself, and a lot more talk like that. In fact, she was the most enthusiastic champion a boy ever had. I determined right then that I would be worthy of her and show her that her confidence was not misplaced." For the next nine years Nancy home schooled Thomas. She passed away a few years prior to Edison's greatest discovery, but her faith in her son continued to propel Thomas forward long after her passing.

Mums, regardless of your children's age, you are the important person in the world to them. Whether you are changing dirty nappies; helping with homework; teaching to drive (biggest parent challenge right there); walking them down the aisle or minding the grandkids - you are more influential than you realise. Physio Talk



SCOLIOSIS

At the end of primary school, heading into high school my best friend was diagnosed with severe scoliosis of the spine. She will forever be my hero for the way she took it all in her stride, at the beginning of adolescence and

with the impending social challenges of that period of your life.

You see, the scoliosis - curvature and twisting - of her spine extended from her high thoracic region through to her lumbosacral area. As a result, she was instructed to wear a Milwaukee Brace, which stretched as a metal support under her chin right down to a plastic splint supporting her pelvis. "Horace" as she promptly named him, was stuck to her like glue. Twenty-three hours a day. The hour of "freedom" consisted of exercise to strengthen her spine. This plan was to avoid steel rods being surgically placed in her spine and was a last resort.

Finding the curve was unexpected and only picked up when her brother noticed a strange lump on her back when she was bending over to jump into the pool. She had no pain to speak of and was a very active kid who played hockey, was in Nippers every weekend and we were always tearing around her neighbourhood on bikes or by foot. Most spinal curvatures in adolescence follow this pattern. It is called Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis (AIS) and accounts for about 80-85% of spinal curvatures. They can vary in severity, and therefore management, and are of an unknown cause. The curvature can progress quite quickly, while our bodies are growing rapidly during this period of our lives. Left untreated it can create other health concerns as the spine places pressure on lungs and the heart, as well as the secondary changes of the joints and muscles because of the vertebrae changing position. Pain often does not occur until these secondary changes start happening and they start complaining of back ache in the day, or night. Thankfully for my bestie, it was picked up early enough and the brace was

successful in stabilising the curve.

Strangely enough, I also developed a scoliosis during adolescence which was a lot milder than my bestie's. I didn't realise at all until I

started getting constant back ache later in my teen years after walking around for long periods and was woken nightly with pain on my left thorax. I didn't know this wasn't normal and tried to stretch and keep fit as best as I could. After I left school, my back pain became often debilitating, especially after starting a new activity or job, or sitting for long hours of study during university days. It was not until towards the end of my Physio degree that it was diagnosed, and I found ways to minimise how it would impact me. This included specific strength exercises, stretches, Pilates and regular hands-on physio to reduce joint

stiffness and muscle tightness. I really wish I had known earlier!

So, even though vour adolescent housemates may not like you "checking out" their bodies - it never hurts to subtly cast an eye on any changes you think may be unusual,



and never ignore any complaints of back pain that persists. If you need a second set of eyes, or someone else they may actually listen to... phone us at Physique.

TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN LANDCARE: CELEBRATING TWENTY YEARS OF REGENERATING OUR FORESTS

Twenty years ago, a group of Mountain volunteers dedicated to preserving and regenerating our precious but fragmented rainforests formed the local chapter of Landcare. The organisation was formally incorporated in March 2003. Since then, they and a generation of other volunteers have worked to restore twenty-five sites to ecological health, with help from paid contractors. These sites include Scenic Rim Regional Council reserves and parks. Our Facebook page generates many "Likes" and positive comments from locals, who appreciate our work of regeneration.

TM Landcare counts over 150 members. Some lend a hand (and a back) to our on-ground work; others staff our very popular Piccabeen Bookshop off Main St, which offers a quality second-hand books and new volumes related to the environment. The funds raised help the organisation buy tubestock and hire contractors to extend the work funded by Council grants.

Residents and visitors have enjoyed helping settle little plants into the ground at our annual National Tree Day planting events, and local school and Scouts youngsters have also contributed to greening

our environment with species that enhance our biodiversity.

In recent years our Landcare Centre on Hartley Rd has attracted many visitors (humans, birds, insects, frogs and lizards). The very accessible site showcases a great array of local species, many

of them suitable for home gardens.

The accompanying photos have been taken by expert photographer and Landcare member, Catherine Douglas, at several of our regenerated sites. They capture aspects of the thriving specimens that have been freed of invasive weeds or planted by our teams. The spectacular "candle" (RIGHT) is a local species, Banksia spinulosa, and the cheery bird (BELOW) is a rufous fantail.







NO NEW BORROWINGS: COUNCIL

Scenic Rim Regional Council's recently released draft budget indicates a sudden halt on obtaining any loans.

During the current fiscal year, the Council approved two loans amounting to \$5,075,000 million.

The first loan, worth \$2,000,000, was designated for Capital Works projects and had a five-year term. The second loan, valued at



\$3.075.000, was intended to finance the purchase of a property on Long Road, Mt Tamborine, to develop a car park. This loan had a two-year term, and the land's \$6.45 million cost, which included a winery, restaurant, and vineyard, was covered using part of the unspent \$15,000,000 loan obtained early in the 2021-2022 year.

These loans increased the Council's total borrowings to \$43.26 million.

Refinancing the Council's loans in 2021 at a fixed low interest rate has proven beneficial, as unspent funds are now being invested at higher interest rates.

In the current budget, the Council projected borrowing over \$6.5 million in the next two fiscal years to support the construction of the Beaudesert Community Hub and Library.

However, according to the draft budget released this month, it appears that a decision has been made to cease any borrowings until the end of the 2027-2028 fiscal year.
