In October 2021, as part of its \$2.5 billion Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, the Federal Government approved \$175,000 in funding for the construction of a new footpath on Alpine Terrace, Tamborine Mountain, for the missing link between St Bernard State School and White Road.

The project aimed to help ensure that students could get to and from school more safely.

After months of activity and traffic disruptions, workmen put the finishing touches to the project at the end of May 2023, but not many foresaw the scale of the visual assault on Alpine Terrace's tree-lined appeal.

The Tamborine Mountain community turned out in force for the Under the Greenwood Tree's launch on Sunday of *Wangalpong to Mount Tamborine*, the first book by Karen Rosser, a fourth-generation Tamborine Mountain local who grew up on a dairy farm on the South End.

Offering fresh insights into the settlement of south east Queensland, the book brings to life the story of The Mountain — known by its traditional custodians the Wangerriburra, as Wangalpong — from its violent birth from the Tweed Volcano millions of years ago to the birth of Queensland in 1859.

The Zamia Theatre was packed to capacity for the launch, the culmination of Karen's years spent researching and compiling the history of Queensland's early settlement, and some of its key figures, which was sparked by a family history project.

Wangalpong to Mount Tamborine was a labour of love that began in 2016, and Karen probably never imagined how much writing would be involved in the book signing following the launch.

A retired science and maths teacher, Karen now lives in North Queensland with her husband, Darby Monro, but still calls the Mountain home.






LOCAL AUTHOR'S BOOK NOMINATED FOR LITERARY PRIZE

Local author Lainie Jones is thrilled that her latest book. A Woman's Place, has been nominated for the ARA Historical Novel Prize. The book, described as 'a family saga set on an outback property haunted by an ancient spirit', explores the lives of five generations of women who live and work on a cattle station known as Barragunyah.

However, just as Barragunyah is far more than a farm, the novel itself is far more than historical fiction. With elements of magical realism, and a touch of Australian Gothic, this is a book that crosses genres.

When asked what inspired her to write A Woman's Place, Lainie says she wanted to



The magical realism aspect can be found in the ancient spirit who orchestrates the fates and fortunes of the women whose lives are intimately bound to Barragunyah, while the Gothic is the isolated heroine trapped in a once-grand house, and the relentless, gloomy skies.

The story begins when Julia, the main character, comes to Barragunyah after her grandmother's death to prepare the place for sale and is trapped by rising floodwaters. Alone, in a derelict house without power, and unable to contact anyone, she passes the time reading the diaries and letters of the women who once called the outback property home.

When the ancient spirit known as Mary appears, the borders between then and now begin to dissolve. Swept again and again into Barragunyah's past, Julia drifts towards madness.

While Julia and her ongoing dilemma anchors the shifting timeframes to to the present, it is Alice who is the first of Barragunyah's women. Migrating to colonial New South Wales in the 1880s, and arriving at Barragunyah as a new bride, she is followed in due course by her descendants, the last of whom is Julia. 'I try to make all my characters true to their historical periods,' Lainie says. 'To make them believable, I also ensure they have valid motivations for behaving as they do."

The title of the book comes from an underlying perception that Barragunyah is a woman's place - at an ancient level the energy there is female. Males are not wanted there, they do not feel comfortable, and can even be in danger. This situation results in some unexpected twists in the story.

One reviewer writes, 'A Woman's Place revolves around an unspoken crime, one grounded and inescapable in Australian history. Jones does a fantastic job of revealing the root of this crime without giving it away, tantalizingly allowing the reader's own imagination to make sense of the darkness where Mary

Tamborine Mountain has been her home for eleven years.

Queensland's health and housing crises are set to worsen as the Palaszczuk Government

continues to appoint ministers with a track record of failure and inaction.

The Palaszczuk Labor Government, with its chaotic state of affairs, is attempting to rebrand itself. The Premier's prioritisation of appearances over actual results is evident, and Queenslanders are suffering as a result. Over the past eight years and with four different Health Ministers, this Government has taken the health system in Queensland into ever deeper problems, with increased (in fact, record) ramping and doubled elective surgery waitlists.

Premier Palaszczuk's ineffective leadership has allowed weak crime laws to shackle the judiciary, resulting in young criminals walking free without consequences, and the government's failure to release land for housing and invest in social housing has left Queenslanders living in dire conditions. Now we have a Health Minister who, as Minister for Child Safety, said in Parliament that information needed to be "washed" before release, and a chief law officer who championed the watering down of youth justice laws that are now bearing their fruit of a youth justice crisis (for a second time – yes that's right, Yvette D'ath failed as Health Minister and so has been rewarded with a second appointment as Attorney-General again).

Queenslanders deserve better than this.

FIRE SAFETY THIS WINTER

Did you know that winter is the peak season for housefires? Most fires are caused by everyday items such as cooking equipment, faulty or poorly maintained appliances, and flammable materials placed too close to heat sources. When heat and toxic smoke start to fill your home, your best chance of survival will be working, interconnected, photoelectric smoke alarms and a well-practised fire escape plan. Take five minutes now to get out alive. Young children and the elderly are the most at risk, so it's especially important to consider how they will escape safely. Make it a priority this winter to draw up an escape plan with multiple exits based on the location of the fire and practice it regularly with your family.

As your State representative, I am always urging the National Parks Department to do more when it comes to hazard reduction burns, in order to ensure that State land does not cause unnecessary danger to residents. Controlled burns, with the aim of reducing fuel loads before high-risk seasons, are always welcomed in the right conditions.

Firstly, the cost of electricity was well and truly going up when the LNP was in power, Labor has put in place direct bill relief for low-income families, pensioners etc. The Labor budget also increased rent assistance, job seeker, youth allowance, parenting payments, Austudy, single parent allowance and aged care worker payments, so I think it's safe to say Labor has tried to help the little guy.

Then there's the Growing Regions program: Labor changed the original LNP Growth Regions Fund because it was being rorted. 96% of the \$272M went to Coalition-held electorates. Mr Buchholz also talks about a map with the electorate of Wright being crossed out (ineligible?); he also mentions a Labor held region of Somerset also being ineligible... at least this would indicate a lack of political bias in regards this program.

I'd like to see this map – I can't find it... maybe it's for ministerial eyes only?

Reading the government's own website pertaining to the Growing Regions program, it sounds to me like a lot of organisations can apply, and this isn't something that is funnelled through MPs and councils, although our own council can apply. According the Mr Buchholz there is a large number of projects and organisations desperate for such funding: Boonah, Beaudesert and Laidley in particular. Seems as though a lot of local organisations are missing out, yet the application process isn't open until the 5th of July.

Instead of running off to parliament and doing the grandstanding thing, why don't you identify who these

Recently lodged Development Applications (DAs): a new tourist attraction at Thunderbird Park, expansion of the IGA shopping centre, 2nd dwelling in Eagles Close (submissions have closed), a granny flat on Henri Robert Dr, a domestic outbuilding on Hartley Rd and a boundary realignment on Alpine Terrace.

Good to see one large redevelopment has engaged locals in its preliminary planning phase to identify and remedy neighbours' concerns before the DA is lodged. What a novel approach! The Precautionary Principle was mentioned by the planners, however I had to point out that I am apparently too ill-informed about this Principle to make meaningful comment.

Out and About: I have attended the opening of Dig-It at Thunderbird Park and it is good to see some thought go into creating a very different tourist attraction catering to families. New classrooms have been officially opened at Tamborine Mountain College, the Regional Tourism Reference Group hosted an event and the Department of Transport and Main Roads canvassed issues ranging from future transport needs to the management of current roadworks.

Five new Tamborine Mountain Aussies were welcomed as part of a citizenship ceremony on Queensland Day – congratulations to Krisztina, Julie, Michael, Koen and Luuk.

I have attended a briefing conducted by the Dept of Regional Development,
Manufacturing and Water in Brisbane which provided updates on the Gold Coast and Logan
Water Plans (Tamborine Mtn straddles both plans) and the QUT Science PhD project which
encompassed the groundwater studies on the Mountain. The results will be published shortly
and I will be able to comment then. There are some concerning findings.

Small Business Month – Destination Scenic Rim hosted a networking event at North Stores, and Travelling Places celebrated its 30th anniversary serving the travel needs of locals whilst employing locals. Well done.

Eat Local Month – I am steadily munching my way around the local businesses participating in this event, commencing with Copperhead (and yes, I pay for my meal and I tip!). Get behind our locals – great to see Clancy's has re-opened as Baileys' Irish Bar & Restaurant.

Community consultation: The Council-hosted "Cuppa in the Communi-tea" on 31 May was very well attended and I thank the service providers who participated and made information available. The free emergency document holder containing disaster preparedness information and a small torch, items to keep children entertained, and a Dalek Power Bank which has a battery life of 500+ recharges was very popular, and these are still available. Several people raised their concerns with me following the Cuppa. I was aware of most of the issues raised however there were a couple of curly ones, including the fencing off council-owned land by a resident.

Topics of concern raised recently: large, inappropriate developments underway with no apparent approvals (being investigated), advertising signage attached to trees (being removed by Council), "temporary" food outlets, the Long Rd extension, vandalism, land valuations (not a council matter), the library incident, the car over the edge at Rotary Lookout and what can be done to prevent a reoccurrence, residential properties used solely as Air B'n'Bs but paying residential rates, and rubbish dumped at the hang gliders site — not good advertising for Maccas and KFC.

"Thank you" to the community member/s who removed the vast amount of toilet paper which festooned the Doughty Park toilet block, in the hope that in doing so the toilets would not be locked. Please be aware of your children's activities after dark.

What are your thoughts on the handrail erected along the Alpine Terrace new footpath? Would you like to see a limit on the number of nights per annum an Air B'n'B can operate? Please email me with your views.

... and finally "thank you" to the barrister who has provided hours of assistance and accompanied me to my formal OIA interview on 5 June. Now we wait to see if I am to be prosecuted as a "vexatious complainant" in relation to issues I raised prior to my



election. Good to see the level playing field is alive and well – providing the complainants are from within Council rather than members of the public.

SONS OF THE FATHERS — DOVER AND SONS by Kyle Hitchmough

There are few businesses with as rich a history as Dover and Sons—boasting a 121-year history, as it was started as a Farmers' Exchange in 1900. Murray Dover has run the Beaudesert branch of his family business for 33 years, and he shares with us today the wisdom that such history can bring.

For those who might not know, what is it that Dover and Sons offers?

LITTER MOTH – Hydrillodes funestalis, picket fence, Driscoll Lane.



This Australian moth occurs in Western Australia, the Northern Territory, Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria, but there is scant online information about the species. I filmed the moth in MacDonald National Park one night, early in December 2012 and photographed this specimen last month. It is always gratifying to find the same species in daylight, even if one has to wait for more than ten years. My *Moths* album has 521 images, a number of which are of the same species, usually seen during the day. The *Night Life* album contains another 23 different moths. Of course, all the night shots are in rainforest, whereas none of the day shots are. Logging the same species at night and in daylight remains a rare occurrence.

a shovel and a crowbar, you drill a hole and thump a post in. They go very quickly, and we sell a lot of them. They're very popular at the moment.

What goes into an average day of work here for you?

I like to be involved in selling as I like to be at the front talking to the customers and listening to any complaints that they may have. I think that's where we need to be, seeing that the customers are looked after.

Are there any particular trends in your clientele?

We have the farmers that have been on their properties for a hundred years, and we have people who want to move out and have a farm who aren't very conversant with farming, so we can help them set up and give them advice in that regard. We have 65 staff between our three locations, and some of them have been with us 30 or 40 years. There's a lot of professionalism there and a lot of knowledge.

You're a Mount Tamborine local. What's your opinion on the mountain area and community?

Yeah, I live on Mount Tamborine. I was born in Boonah, which is a lovely little town, and Tamborine still has that rural lifestyle, which is what I like about it. You can do deals on a handshake. People interact with each other, they help each other. Unlike some areas in the city, where you don't know who your neighbours are.

What do you feel Dover and Sons really provides to the area?

We provide spare parts and workshop facilities to help people with parts and breakdowns, for anyone on the land who has a breakdown or needs assistance. We're an agricultural and lifestyle company, and we won't be changing. Things like the Stihl chainsaws and brushcutters and the Toro mowers and the gear like that are for people who have small acreage... any way we can assist.

What's your favourite thing about doing this?

Probably interacting with country-minded people. We sell a lot of gear out west to the Northern Territory, Canungra, Longreach, St. George, so we're in touch with the heart of Australia. A lot of people think nobody lives west of the Great Divide. The other thing I've always been very vocal about is the deregulation of the dairy industry and the Coles dollar-litre milk. That really devastated an industry. There are still people who will buy Coles milk instead of the branded milk, and that's one of the most upsetting things in the agricultural industry in Australia. The dairy farmers have been leaving in droves and it's one of the most buoyant industries that we have.







But it must have looked like strobe light to dogs, whose flicker fusion rate is around 80 frames per second.

Dog TV started in the USA in 2012 – it is now also a streaming service of scientifically developed content for dogs. The programs are organised into types: relaxing, stimulating and exposure – to various sounds, like doorbells, car horns, etcetera. The colours and the contrast are slightly exaggerated, because dog vision is very different to human vision – they see the world in fewer hues than we do, but they do have two colour receptors: blue and yellow. Yet their ability to see motion is far superior to us.

Dog TV streaming costs start at around \$10 a month, and the higher the cost the better the quality, usually. The stimulating streaming has videos of dogs playing together or playing fetch with their humans and dogs just going for walks. The relaxing videos are of dogs stretching and sleeping, with classical music, sounds of nature like gentle ocean waves and chirping birds. Random human voices are sometimes added saying things like 'good dog' in a calm soft voice. Bubbles float up and bounce around the screen. The creators claim to have based the dog channel and streaming on more than sixty scientific studies conducted by animal experts and scientists from different universities all over the word. They even detail a few of these studies on their website.

What do the reviews say? While a dog's sense of smell is a primary way for them to explore and understand their world, hearing and vision are also important, and Dog TV exposes dogs to new stimuli. According to an Amazon review, 71% of users gave it a rating between 1 – 5 stars, 43% gave it a five-

Nothing can replace a human interacting with their dog, and they need exercise, company and things to occupy them. Dog TV can occupy them at intervals when an owner is away or at work. The longest most dogs can focus on the screen is about one hour at a time, so programs can be timed.

She decluttered her personal space and set a manifesto to buy nothing new (except for food) for 3 months and then to give away an item every time a new item entered her world.

PROTECT MAND SOCIALISE

Two of the roles that parents have in their children's lives are to protect and to socialise. Often those roles are at odds with each other. I remember one of our son's earliest experiences in socialising. He was our first-born so was not familiar with sharing his toys with a sibling. He was around six months old when I took him to a gathering where there were several children older than himself. As he sat on the floor with a toy that had taken his interest, another child came along and snatched it away. He didn't cry but his expression conveyed confusion and he looked up at me as if to ask: "What just happened?" My mother's heart wanted to scoop him up and take him back to the safe haven of home where everyone was kind to him. Instead, I told myself that this was his first lesson in learning that this world won't always treat you justly. I sensed that this was the first of many unavoidable experiences that would build resilience and social skills into his life.

Parents balance a juggling act between protecting their children from situations that are harmful to their well-being, while helping them connect with a world outside the family. This is especially challenging as kids reach their teenage years and assert their independence. Home should be the launching pad where they learn what it means to be safe and what they need to survive. Children will copy your actions in preference to what you tell them, so it's important to model safe behaviours and healthy boundaries.


Reducing restrictions over time gives your child room to demonstrate they can be trusted and make good decisions. Increased freedom comes through knowing your child is able to look after him or herself, and this is a reward for both of you. Encourage your child's unique interests and hobbies, as they lead to independence and self-determination as well as social opportunities with peers who share the same interests.

Today's parents have less control and more responsibility than previous generations. Never have there been so many influences intruding into the family home. Often, the message parents receive is that they shouldn't impose their own values on their children. But if parents don't teach their children values, the pervading culture will. Social influencers, large corporations, advertising agencies are relaying unhealthy values to our kids every day. Parents are often blamed for adolescent turmoil; however, the source is more likely to be culturally created problems than poor parenting.

In a culture with limited community support, the task of raising healthy, well-adjusted children is not an easy one. Time and energy are scarce commodities when parents work long hours at jobs that are often far from home. Be intentional with the available time you have with your children. Even household tasks done together can be an opportunity for meaningful conversation. Make your home a safe shelter from which your children will successfully launch into the world.

SENSITIVE SYSTEMS

Meet Bonnie, our six-month-old pup who has stolen the hearts of everyone at Physique and become a delightful reminder of

the power of love and companionship we all need. You might've seen her in clinic from time to time or on her walks and café visits all over the mountain. If you happen to be walking past, she absolutely loves a pat and cuddle, so don't be shy!

When Bonnie had her needles as a 3-month-old puppy we got a glimpse of how sensitive she truly is. The vet proclaimed her as probably the "sookiest dog" he had come across in some time. Bonnie has a particular squeal which she lets out when she experiences what most would consider to be mildly unpleasant experiences, e.g. vaccination needle or being shown that you in fact should not poop on the carpet. These are not particularly painful or terrible experiences for most of us however for my poor sooky dog they are.

This got me thinking about how you can go from doing everything normally one day and the next be incapacitated and unable to bend down to get your shoes on. How is it that things can change so quickly that simple, easy tasks become excruciating, impossible jobs that need to be left unfinished?

This phenomenon is due to our body's inbuilt super protective mechanisms which keep us all safe every single day. I like to use the examples of an ankle sprain and a back injury. When you sustain an ankle injury your body instinctively gets the weight off the injured foot, it swells up and lets you know it's injured by hurting like hell. You stop using the foot for a few days until all of a sudden you can get that foot down again.

Let's switch examples now - you lift a heavy object while you're in a funny position and all of a sudden you can't straighten your back, and every time you

try to move, it feels like your back is about to cave in. This is a nasty yet all too common story I hear when people hurt their back. This catchy, jolting feeling is the same system protecting you that makes you limp/stay off a sprained

ankle. Of course, we can't "not use" our back, so our brain does its best to stop us doing silly things which might aggravate the injury.

This usually lasts for a few days to a couple of weeks before things improve. Our bodies' protective systems can be a little bit like Bonnie - dramatic and overreactive. It's important to listen to these messages for the first week or so as our bodies begin to heal.

These messages start to become less reliable after a few weeks as our systems can tend to be too

overreactive. If you have significant pain and discomfort after a week or so, it's important to see someone who can help you pinpoint the cause of the pain/injury and assist you with a treatment plan to get back to full function. 
Chest Rub and Nasal Roll On to contain these blockbuster ingredients. Because for me, the options that I saw were not conducive to lung health.

SWEET POTATO AND LENTIL SOUP

Velvety smooth roasted sweet potato bursting with spicy southern flavours, mixed with pops of texture from proteinrich lentils and finished with a dash of cream is a surefire way to warm both the body and soul.

My sweet potato and lentil soup really is a super easy meal. Whether enjoyed on a chilly winter evening, as an after school slurpfest with hot toast, or as a nourishing starter. My sweet potato and lentil soup brings together earthy sweetness with a delicate balance of southern spices and aromatics. Get ready to savour spoonfuls of pure comfort as we dive into the delightfully delicious world of homemade soup, this heartwarming dish promises to satisfy and enchant even the harshest of critics.

Did you know? Contrary to popular belief, sweet potatoes are not related to regular potatoes. The origin of the humble sweet potato is surprisingly shrouded in mystery and has a fascinating history. They are said to be native to Central and South America, and were first cultivated as a food source over 5,000 years ago by ancient civilisations like the Incas and Aztecs. These civilisations quickly recognised the incredible nutritional value of sweet potatoes and prized them as a staple food. Master seafaring nations like the Polynesians mysteriously got their hands on this amazing staple and worshipped the remarkable tuber as a life-giving force and planted this crop from island to island wherever they went on their adventures across the vast Pacific Ocean. It still remains a popular food till this day.

Chef Dylan's tips 1. It's vital to try to cut the sweet potato into uniform pieces. This ensures even cooking and prevents some pieces from becoming overly charred while others remain undercooked. 2. Don't be stingy with the olive oil because coating the sweet potato pieces generously with oil helps to achieve a crispy exterior during roasting. 3. It's essential to space the sweet potato pieces out on the baking sheet, allowing for proper airflow, and ensuring they roast rather than steam.

Memory Lane - Dundee, Scotland 2022

I make my way up the well-worn sandstone stairs that lead to an enchanted garden where blooming pale primrose petals dance across the rocks, and emerald velvet grass seems to calm all who enter. The cloudless azure sky overhead is a wonderful change from the usually dreary grey that I'm accustomed to whenever I'm here. Continuing on, I reach the Invercarse Hotel, a quaint watering hole with a timeless charm, quenching the thirst of many a weary traveller since 1878. Taking a seat on the sunkissed terrace, I shelter beneath the shade of two giant Scots pine trees. The view from

here is breathtaking. I delight in the way the light shimmers and dances across the mercury-coloured Tay as it snakes its way out to the North Sea. The air is crisp and seemingly alive with the chorus of birdsong, somehow echoing the very essence of nature's harmony. Savouring the tranquility, I close my eyes and breathe in the serenity. "Excuse me sir?" comes a voice in a thick Scottish accent, as melodious as the birds above. I look up to see a tall, exceptionally dressed young man in a 3-piece suit. As he hands me the menu, I catch a glimpse of an intricate tattoo just above his flashy wristwatch glinting in the sunlight. "The soup of the day is roasted sweet potato and lentil" he says, with a sparkle in his eyes that mirrors the flowing river below. "I've just had it for lunch and can say with utmost certainty that it's one of the chef's best yet. "Well, then" I reply, "let's put your tastebuds to the test" I add with a touch of jest in my voice. "Put me down for a soup of the day, please. "Now I'm feeling the pressure!" he says with a laugh, "Would you like a drink with that?" "A pint of Tennent's please." "Sure thing pal, I'll sort it for you now" he says as he turns and heads towards the bar. I gaze back over the river towards the kingdom of Fife and two giant herring gulls glide effortlessly through the vast sky. 'Scotland in the sun is undeniably one of the most strikingly beautifully counties on earth' I think to myself; as I lean back, a deep sense of gratitude wells up and sends a warm glow from my heart tingling across my skin.

Serves 4 Prep time 15 mins Cook time 20 mins

Ingredients:

- 2 sweet potatoes, about 1kg (peeled and chopped into 4cm chunks)
- 1 medium onion, diced 1 cm
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced



- 3 cups vegetable or chicken stock
- 1x 400g can cooked brown lentils
- 1/2 cup thickened cream
- Olive oil to drizzle

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C. Place the sweet potatoes into a bowl and generously drizzle with olive oil, and add Creole. Toss to coat evenly.
- Roast sweet potato in the oven for about 25-30 minutes or until the sweet potatoes are tender and slightly caramelised.
- In a large pot, heat another drizzle of olive oil over medium heat.
 Add the chopped onion and minced garlic. Sizzle until the onion becomes translucent and fragrant.
- Add the roasted sweet potatoes to the pot, followed by the vegetable or chicken stock. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat and let it simmer for about 10 minutes, allowing the flavours to meld together.
- Using an immersion blender or regular blender, puree the soup until smooth and creamy. If using a regular blender, work in batches and be cautious of the hot liquid.
- 6. Return the soup to the pot, add the lentils and stir in the cream, heat the soup over low heat until it is warmed through.
- 7. Taste and adjust the seasoning if needed. If the soup is too thick, you can add more stock or cream to achieve your desired consistency.
- 8. Serve the roasted sweet potato soup steaming hot, garnished with your choice of garnish such as chopped fresh coriander, a dollop of sour cream, or toasted pumpkin or pepita seeds and a slice of toast lathered in butter.

FRIENDS OF TAMBORINE NATIONAL PARK

If you've ever wondered about the white painted posts dotted near walking tracks in Tamborine National Park, look closely and you will see that each is paired with a little plant. These propagated native seedlings have been specially chosen for the location and are planted to revegetate the area.

Looking after the environment like this is a labour of love for the volunteers of the Friends of Tamborine National Park. Each month, people from a range of backgrounds converge on a different section of the National Park for a working bee. With tools, seedlings, buckets of water and old sacks, they remove weeds and make space for new vegetation. Plants that look beautiful in a backyard can become invasive species that "take over" in National Parks, and weeding is a constant effort. Our tasks are coordinated by extremely knowledgeable volunteers so there is always someone available to answer the question, "What plant (or animal/bird) is this?". Of course, a break for morning tea is a great time for learning about the country and its history, or just having a laugh.

Our current project on Tamborine Mountain involves weeding and planting near the entry to the Witches Falls section (off Main Western Road). Many visitors and locals enjoy this, the oldest National Park in Queensland and we have been encouraged by their comments as they walk by. We are removing Cape ivy, Chinese star jasmine, Madeira vine and Polka dot plant and planting out natives such as Narrow leafed cordyline, Mat rush, Dianella and Native ginger. Within a few years, this section will provide visitors to Witches Falls with a wonderful entry to the Park.

Members of the community are always welcome to volunteer. If you visit national parks or just appreciate being in nature, this is a great way to "give back". A few hours working side by side with others who have an interest in the environment is very rewarding.

DEMENTIA – THE CARING EXPERIENCE

Dementia, the broad term used to define the symptoms of a large group of illnesses that cause a progressive decline in a person's cognition and ability to function, describes a loss of memory, intellect, rationality, social skills and what would be considered normal emotional reactions. These changes impact the physical, social, and emotional life of not only the person with dementia, but also those who care for them namely, their families, carers and friends. There are different forms of dementia, and each has its own cause. Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia. Dementia is not a normal part of ageing.

If you are caring for someone with dementia, it is important to take regular breaks to keep up to relax/recharge.

How to take a break

One way to do this is to arrange regular *Respite Care* for the person with dementia. Respite gives you a break from constant caring, which can be physically and emotionally demanding. Enjoying some 'time-out' helps you return to your caring role refreshed. Respite also benefits the person with dementia, as it introduces them to different people and activities. Family and friends may help take over the caring role from you sometimes; when this is not possible, there are services that offer different types of Respite Care. Respite may be inhome, day-care, short or long-term or even a break away together with additional help.

Commonwealth Carers Respite
Centre (1800 059 059) can assist you identify respite care available for you as a Carer. For your concerns about using Respite Care, you may contact the National Dementia Behaviour Advisory Service (NDBAS - 1300 366 448).

Remember: though the change in environment may be initially disturbing to some persons with dementia, they usually settle in. Many families and Carers have found it beneficial to start regular respite care as *early as possible*, so that everyone has time to get used to it.

Needless to say, the final decision is yours!
