DISASTER VEGETATION COUNCIL COLLECTION SET TO COMMENCE

As Scenic Rim Regional Council continues the cleanup from the Christmas and New Year storms, it is set to begin the mammoth task of collecting disaster-related vegetation impacting residents at Tamborine and Tamborine Mountain.

Having focused on clearing debris from public spaces and roadways to ensure community safety, Council is grateful for assistance provided through the jointly-funded Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) which will provide for the collection of disaster-related vegetation generated by the Christmas storm event impacting homes and access to residential properties in these areas.

The collection, originally scheduled to commence on 29 January, will now begin on Monday 5 February and take place in four areas in coming weeks, weather permitting, and will not include green waste from general yard maintenance, commercial waste or planned clearing work.

Residents are asked to place only disaster-related vegetation on the roadside verge before the collection period begins as each street will be visited only once and disaster vegetation which misses the collection will not be removed by Council as part of this service.

Care should be taken to ensure vegetation left for collection will not block drivers' sight lines or stormwater runoff or pose a hazard to pedestrians.

Only clean disaster-related vegetation will be removed and debris piles including anything other than disaster-related vegetation, such as green waste from yard maintenance or building/commercial or household waste, will be left in place for the resident to dispose of.

The collection areas and timeframes, subject to weather conditions, are:

- Area 1 Tamborine Mountain South of Curtis Road and Beacon Road - 7am Monday 5 February 2024 to 5pm 9 February 2024
- Area 2 Tamborine Mountain West of Geissmann Road and North of Beacon Road – 7am Monday 12 February 2024 to 5pm 16 February 2024

- Area 3 Tamborine Mountain North East of Geissmann Road and Curtis Road – 7am Monday 19 February 2024 to 5pm 23 February 2024, and
- Area 4 Tamborine Village 7am Monday 26 February 2024 to 5pm 1 March 2024.

As further rain is likely in coming weeks and may result in delays or changes to the collection schedule, updates will be provided on Council's website, scenicrim.qld.gov. au, facebook page and the notice board of the Community Recovery Hub which has been set up next to the Tamborine Mountain Library at 30-32 Main Street.

The Community Recovery Hub is providing those impacted by the severe weather events of the Christmas-New Year period ongoing access to information, support and hardship assistance from a range of recovery agencies.



REJECTION FOR YOUNG STREET CABIN PROPOSAL

A disputed tourism project planned next to the Tamborine Mountain escarpment was turned down by the Scenic Rim Regional Council in a recent full meeting.

The proposal by East Asia Investment Pty Ltd for a development at 36 Young Street had faced 200 objections during its public review phase in 2022, with the council's urban planners noting ongoing opposition afterward. Cr Amanda Hay, who had previously objected to the project before her election, stepped aside due to a conflict of interest and did not participate in the discussion or vote. The council's unanimous decision to reject the proposal for 10 short-term rental cabins across six buildings on the 4.36ha site was unexpected, especially since the planners had advised its approval. Deputy Mayor Jeff McConnell led the charge against the recommendation, presenting a detailed report on his concerns about the project's fit for the area. He elaborated on why the development did not comply with the Planning Scheme's standards for a residential zone, particularly highlighting the identified risks of landslip and landslides. McConnell's arguments included: The plan for 10 cabins over a 60m stretch did not meet the Planning Scheme's criteria for small-scale, low-density development. The project breached the 20-metre boundary setback rule, affecting its suitability. It would reduce the privacy and comfort of nearby residents, violating residential zone guidelines. The infrastructure, including water tanks with a capacity of 100,000 litres and the output from the wastewater treatment and stormwater systems, could exacerbate landslide risks. Cr Marshall

Chalk supported McConnell's stance, with Mayor Greg Christensen and Cr Michael Enright also voicing their support for McConnell's motion. In 2017, the council had approved three bedrooms in the existing house on the site for 'bed and breakfast' short-term lodging.

TM ARTS PRECINCT LAUNCH DRAWS GREAT INTEREST



A hundred-plus guests attended the public launch and presentation of the Tamborine Mountain Arts Precinct on Sunday, 11 Feb 2024 at Mason Wines, Tamborine Mountain.

The event was open to the public but bookings filled quickly.

People were keen to hear Glen Pittock, co-founder and industrial designer, who has completed projects for Scenic Rim Regional Council, and Ashley Tardy, chairperson and Senior Concept Artist, present their concept of a new project for a Creative Arts Precinct on Gallery Walk.

The intention is to raise public funds to purchase the Tamborine Mountain Vineyards & Winery, presently owned by SRRC Council, "to build a cultural haven".

Public donations will be 100% tax deductible.

The Winery was to be auctioned on 8 December 2023. Council voted unanimously to postpone the auction to allow the TMAP to form and register as a Not-For-Profit

Association, and become a viable bidder.

The Association hopes to raise the funds needed to purchase the property before it returns to auction in May 2024.

They can then apply for government grants needed to develop the project.

Glen and Ashley talked of how they would like to see a walk-through precinct, from the proposed new council car park, which would provide the visitor with a range of artistic mediums on display and include a kitchen to provide refreshments.

Ashley would like to pay tribute to her late mother, Kate Tardy, who spent 17 years involved in arts and theatre on Tamborine Mountain prior to her passing in 2023.

Kate was a prolific painter, sang in the choir and was Vice President of the local Zamia Theatre where she produced five plays that she had written herself. Kate also enjoyed

> being a seamstress and designed and hand-stitched costumes for her performers.

Ashley says her mother's greatest satisfaction was the opportunity to change lives, working with children who saw theatre as an escape from personal problems.

Some of those same students were in attendance at 'Mumma Kate's' funeral and spoke of how their lives had been changed through theatre.

Ashley would like to establish an annual award, through the establishment of the Arts Precinct, as a final gift to honour the creativity of her mother.



DECISION A WELCOME REVERSAL

At a recent Council meeting, Councillors voted 6-0 to refuse a Planning Department recommendation to approve a tourism development application at 36 Young Street, Tamborine Mountain, which would have resulted in ~ 1000m² built form, within reduced setbacks, against the boundaries of 11 rural residential properties. All but one building would have been partially or entirely within Council's highest risk landslide hazard zone on the Escarpment.

The DA was lodged in 2020 and had been recommended for approval twice by the Planning Department – initially, incorrectly assessed under the wrong Overlay Code as a 'medium' landslide risk; and other critical assessments throughout were based on figures found by Peer Reviews to be 'conservative'. These errors were drawn to the attention of the Planning Department by residents during the submissions phase and repeatedly, at significant personal cost to some, over the past 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ years.

Division 2 Councillor Jeff McConnell, who engaged in consultation with potentially impacted landowners, was instrumental in Council's 6-0 refusal. Having lodged an objection to the proposal prior to her election, Cr Amanda Hay, Division 1, was required to abstain.

Succinctly citing the intent and content of the Planning Scheme, Cr McConnell implored Council not to approve a development that could potentially jeopardise the safety of people and property. He also presented a balanced view that development could occur, safely, on appropriate sites elsewhere on the Mountain where the amenity and privacy of residential areas could be maintained.

On a refreshing note for residents, Cr McConnell said that setbacks must be maintained, particularly when tourism development seeks to encroach on residential areas.

On an issue of fundamental importance, Cr McConnell stated that Council should not create legacy issues by approving more development in risk-prone areas. We have only to consider the on-going misery and financial loss at Shelf Road to appreciate the wisdom of this stance.

In a loss for Division 2, Cr McConnell has chosen to run for the position of Mayor in the upcoming election. His balanced outlook and calm leadership style may well benefit all Divisions. The current leadership under Mayor Greg Christensen has seen our Council descend into such dysfunction that an Administrator had to be appointed by the State Government, at huge expense to ratepayers.

Councillors' strong 6-0 stance to preserve the safety and amenity of the Mountain and its residents may soon be challenged by the developer in the Planning and Environment Court. Considering the important and far-reaching principles involved, residents expect Council to vigorously defend its final decision in the event of an appeal through the court system. Failure to do so will result in disastrous precedents and legacy issues for the Scenic Rim.

Let's hope that this recent unanimous decision signals a change that will persist through the upcoming election and into much-needed administrative reforms within Council.

WHO IS GOVERNING US?

The Office of Independent Assessor was formed in December 2018, by the Labor Government, to deal with complaints against Council.

In fact, the OIA has been targeting members of the public, who attempt to

complain against Council, in what can be seen as an attack on free speech.

Cr. Amanda Hay is one OIA victim who has been issued with a summons to appear at the Brisbane Magistrates Court to face charges prior to her becoming a councillor.

Her alleged crime was to issue a letter to councillors voicing her displeasure at the content and wording of a motion proposed by Cr Enright, and carried unanimously.

Ms Hay, who was at the time, a private citizen and retired public servant with a background in compliance and investigation, and a spotless record, is not the only victim.

A private businessman has told me of how he received a warning letter from the OIA, after sending a complaint to his local councillor and the Mayor.

Former councillor, Derek Swanborough, a man of over 40 years experience in local Government, was forced to resign after 76+ complaints were made against him. All but one originating from within council and only three of these being upheld.

One local newspaper, the *Fassifern Guardian*, which had reported on Cr Swanborough's predicament, was ordered, by the OIA, to release confidential notes of a private interview. The newspaper successfully defended against this in the Supreme Court.

These questionable OIA actions have been directed at one small regional council with a population of less than 45 000. Where else has the OIA been acting in this authoritarian manner to silence the citizens?

In June 2019 the SRRC joined the international body of ICLEI (International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives). There was no public consultation and some councillors aren't even aware of it.

The implications of such a move may appear to be innocent but do we need some unelected international body of billionaires infiltrating our local government? We have our own indigenous and environmental caretakers who understand our environment better than anyone.

The situation that arose when we were isolated by the storm made us dependent on each other. That was the only way we were able to survive. Volunteers took control, cleared roads and checked on their neighbours.

The council, under the weight of regulations and processes, took four weeks to start clearing the debris.

This concern about interference in local government by world powers is coming home to us.

I noted a comment made by former Federal politician George Christensen, who has decided to stand for local council office (Mackay).

"I am determined to fight back against the globalist encroachment into local politics. Sadly, there are pervasive globalist agendas within local government, especially through the adoption of initiatives like Agenda 2030, which erode local autonomy and freedoms. An example of such an initiative is the 15 Minute City concept, an idea being pursued by many local councils that restricts personal liberties and freedom of movement." he said.

We must be mindful of who we elect to council on 16 March 2024. It is not a popularity contest.

We need the best minds, which have been educated by experience and maturity and have survived in a World teetering on the edge of social collapse.

The unelected, elite globalists are not interested in protecting our freedoms, our possums, or our opinions.







OUR STAFF BOOK CHOICE: Convict Orphans by Lucy Frost



All families have their secrets, and a convict ancestor or an illegitimate birth were shames that families once buried deep. Among the best-hidden stories in Australia's history are those of the convict orphans.

Agnes arrived on a convict transport aged four and was abandoned when her mother needed to escape an abusive husband. After their mother died and their father deserted them, Maria and Eliza Marriner were taken into state care too. Cut off from family, behind the walls of the imposing sandstone buildings of the Queen's Orphan Schools, they were among hundreds of young children entrusted to the much feared Matron Smyth. At the age of twelve, the children left the orphanage to work without pay on farms and in homes - some of them places where no child should ever have been sent. Although colonists called it white slavery, the authorities turned a blind eye to what was really happening. These are stories of abuse and abandonment, and also of great generosity and kindness from individuals who rescued and supported children.



VULNERABILITY



Vulnerability means being exposed to the possibility of being harmed, either physically or emotionally. A position where another person can hurt you is not a position that any of us want to be in. So why do it? Why not just roll into a ball and present our spikes to the world? Because vulnerability is the only path to genuine human connection. When we stop trying to appear perfect and are willing to share our rough edges, we invite others to let their walls down and be honest about their own frailties.

It's not easy to be vulnerable because there is risk of rejection involved. To avoid it, we adopt protective behaviours. We consistently keep within 'safe' shallow conversation topics, so we don't offend. We make plans that keep others happy because we don't want to disappoint anyone. We suppress our opinions and emotions, keeping them bottled up. We avoid anything controversial or doing anything unique that makes us stand out. The mere thought of someone disliking us keeps us awake at night. People-pleasing, hiding faults, covering tracks and blaming others are spines we present to the world in order to avoid vulnerability.


Try practicing vulnerability in your everyday life. Discuss with a friend what's happening in your world. Perhaps you had a run-in with someone that left you confused, or maybe you're dealing with something new at work. Start with the facts then share how this experience impacted you. The experience doesn't have to be negative; it could be something meaningful. Sharing with a trusted friend a secretly harboured desire and why it's important to you is a great way to practice vulnerability and gain a cheerleader.

Don't keep your feelings hidden. Any topic that evokes difficult emotions for you is an opportunity to work through. You might hold a fear about your past or current challenges- having the vulnerability to name this aloud to another person diminishes its power and relieves its sting. The ultimate form of vulnerability is expressing how you feel toward someone. Let a friend or family member know that you really admire and value who they are as a person. Reveal to a loved one about the pain you carry from a rupture in your relationship. Exposing our inner self takes courage but reaps rewards.

Vulnerability is not about what you do, it's about why you're doing it. It's the intention behind your behaviour that makes it truly vulnerable. The goal of vulnerability is not to look more vulnerable, it's simply to express yourself as genuinely as possible. When we do this, we create opportunity for true, authentic connections.

TIME FOR HEALING

This week, as I worked on my property, I noticed something missing. Something that had been a constant in the back of my mind and the background of my hearing for the past 7 weeks. I realised that the distant drone of machinery had ceased.

The thrum of the generators pumping away at my house and my neighbours' places, the noise of chainsaws being pushed to their limits and the myriad of noises associated with tractors and bobcats and front-end loaders. Now, if I stop using my own machinery long enough, I can actually sit in relative silence again. The Mountain, it appears, is slowly starting to heal.

And there are other signs too. The birds are back. And with a hunger. Our place is almost overrun with loud, obnoxious Lorikeets feasting on the avocados that were stripped off our trees. Our poor resident King Parrots can't get a look in at the bird feeder at the moment! And what about the fuzz on the trees? What a sight to behold, these magnificent parts of creation defying the destruction around them. Only this week I had a second look when I realised the fuzz was almost gone to be replaced with a beautiful covering of full leaves.

Of course, there is still clean-up going on. I think it'll be another few months before I get to the big trees down in my paddock. And there also is damage that will take much, much longer to repair. But, the Mountain, and our community are healing. Every time we have an event like this, I am surprised at our ability to heal. Each time, it feels like we'll never be the same. And yet, again and again, we all find a way. It is incredible to witness.

And, it is the same with our bodies. We are actually designed to be able to heal, for our bodies to go through a process which leads us towards recovery. But, what many people do not understand is

THE AUSTRALIAN CATTLE DOG OR 'HEELER'

The blue-black and the red-tan cattle dogs are both exactly the same breed. They are a medium size dog standing about 42-50cm from the shoulder and should weigh between 16-23kg. Their original breeding took a few attempts to get the desired working dog. The first attempt started with the English Smithfield being

crossed with a dingo. Those pups ended up killing their herds instead of rounding them up! Next, a rough coated collie (Lassie dog) was crossed with a dingo, but these dogs barked too much and stressed the cattle.

Then in 1840 Tom Hall, an Englishman bred a blue smooth coat collie with a dingo and deemed it a success and named his breed Hall's Heelers. Two brothers Jack & Harry Baguet tried to improve on Halls breed by adding a Dalmatian but this didn't work well, so they bred the heeler and Dalmatian with a kelpie. Finally,



more breeding with dingos produced the heelers we see today, they possess selected dingo, kelpie, dalmatian, and



collie DNA. Interestingly; heeler puppies are born white the same as Dalmatians, and some lines have a stumpy tail as the original Smithfield did.

This breed needed to be hardy, able to herd cattle over hundreds of kilometres of hard ground in hot and cold weather with cattle used to roaming, and sometimes stubborn. Heelers are intelligent and easy to train, they have high energy and hunting instinct and may chase cars in suburbia. If they do not get enough exercise you could begin to see problematic behaviours like excessive barking, chewing and nipping. They need training so that their protective instinct does not lean towards aggression or fear towards strangers. Many have tendencies to nip, often at heels but this can be trained out, preferably when they are young. Mental enrichment and continuous training a must for this breed. I got to know a few heelers in rescue, two were very nippy and needed full time training preferably with someone at least partially bonded to them, another I managed to understand and train, but unfortunately none of them made it to a good home. Having a poor start to life compounded unwanted tendencies.

Australian heelers live up to 15 years, the oldest dog on record was a blue heeler named Bluey, he lived 29 years and died in 1939. But they do have a few health issues they are prone to: deafness is noted in some blood lines, progressive retinal atrophy causing blindness, obesity, bladder and Kidney stones and dental problems.
